At a meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall on the 5th day of May, 1919, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, J. C. Clevinger, Alex Elliott, R. Thompson, H. E. Ratliff and W. P. Call.

The minutes of the meetings of March 3rd, March 8th, March 18th, March 22nd, April 7th and April 12th, 1919, were read and approved.

Councilman H. E. Ratliff tendered his <sup>written</sup> resignation as councilman, which is as follows:

To Mayor and city Councilmen,  
"Pikeville,

I hereby tender my resignation as city councilman for City of Pikeville, Ky., to take effect at once.  
H. E. Ratliff."

W. P. Call moved that same be accepted. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, which carried unanimously, and the mayor declared said office vacant.

J. C. Clevinger placed in nomination for city councilman F. P. Damon and moved that he be appointed as such. W. P. Call seconded said motion. There being no other nominations upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, "yes"; Alex Elliott, "yes"; R. Thompson, "yes"; and W. P. Call, "yes". The mayor declared F. P. Damon duly elected as a member of the City Council of Pikeville, Kentucky.

F. P. Damon appeared before the city council and took the oath of office as city councilman as required by law.

Ordered that

Fabric Fire Hose Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$600<sup>00</sup> for 600 feet of hose for city.

Ordered that

Andy Chafins be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$2<sup>00</sup> for cleaning side walks on Alpine Avenue for city.

Ordered that

John Vanover be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$1<sup>00</sup> for cleaning side walks on Alpine Avenue in lieu of his claim of \$2<sup>50</sup>.

Councilman R. Thompson tendered his written resignation as councilman, which is as follows:

"Pikeville, Ky.  
May 5, 1919,

To Mayor and city Councilmen:

I hereby tender my resignation as councilman for the city of Pikeville, to take effect at once.

R. Thompson"

J. C. Clevinger moved that said resignation be accepted. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, which carried unanimously, and the mayor declared said office vacant.

J. C. Clevinger placed in nomination for city councilman H. E. Syck and moved that he be appointed as such. F. P. Damon seconded said motion. There being no other nominations upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, "yes"; F. P. Damon, "yes"; Alex Elliott, "yes"; and W. P. Call, "yes". The mayor declared H. E. Syck duly elected as a member of the City Council of Pikeville, Kentucky.

H. E. Syck appeared before the city council and took the oath of office as required by law.

J. C. Clevinger, Alex Elliott and R. Thompson, appointed as a committee to carry into effect the report of said committee made April 7th, 1919, which report made recommendations with reference to the city fire department and its needs, made the following written report:

"To the mayor and city council:  
We, the undersigned fire committee make the following report:

Said committee met and appointed J. C. Clevinger to go to Louisville and Cincinnati and make the necessary purchase of fire wagon & equipment. That pursuant to said authority said J. C. Clevinger went to Frankfort to consult with the State Actuary Bureau, who has charge of the fire risks of the city and state, and acting upon his advice Mr. Clevinger purchased from the St. Bernard Fire Company the fire wagon and equipment. A copy of the equipment purchased from the St. Bernard Fire Dept., also a receipt for the purchase price of \$650<sup>00</sup> paid by J. C. Clevinger individually filed herewith, also purchased 1000 feet of fire hose, which is at railroad station, also contracted for the purchase of team of horses, harness and wagon at \$500<sup>00</sup>, subject to the approval of the Council. A copy of the requirements of the State Fire Actuary is filed herewith. Said wagon was shipped the 2nd day of May, 1919.

Clevinger, yes; F. P. Damon, yes; W. P. Call, no; Alex Elliott, yes; and H. E. Syck, yes. The mayor declared said motion carried and the report accepted and approved and discharged said committee.

The city clerk's settlement with the chief of police for month of April, 1919 is filed, accepted and approved.

The city clerk's settlement with the police judge for month of April, 1919 is filed, accepted and approved.

W. P. Call moved that the city clerk be directed to make settlements with the city treasurer as to amounts of money collected and disbursed by him, J. C. Clevinger seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Ordered that

E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$12 50, \$9 25 of which is 4% commission for collecting \$243 89 taxes for year 1918; and \$2 25 of which is for serving eleven notices for city.

The mayor appointed W. P. Call, J. C. Clevinger and G. L. Ratley to prepare an ordinance in accordance with the specifications, recommendations &c made by the Kentucky Actuarial Bureau.

J. C. Clevinger introduced an ordinance entitled "an ordinance penalizing property owners for allowing stock to run at large," and moved that said ordinance be passed. H. E. Syck seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, yes; H. E. Syck, yes; W. P. Call, yes; F. P. Damon, yes; and Alex Elliott, yes. As all present voted for said motion, the mayor declared said ordinance passed.

Mel McCay appeared before the council and asked to be released from his contract to clean the streets of the city, take care of its fire hose &c, as his contract had expired. Upon motion made, seconded and unanimously carried said McCay is hereby released from said contract.

W. P. Call introduced an ordinance entitled "an ordinance extending certain streets and opening and establishing new streets," and moved that said ordinance be passed. H. E. Syck seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: W. P. Call, yes; H. E. Syck, yes; J. C. Clevinger, yes; Alex Elliott, yes; and F. P. Damon, yes; as all Councilmen present voted for said motion, the mayor declared said ordinance passed.

The mayor appointed H. E. Syck, F. P. Damon and J. M. Hatcher to investigate the establishment of new streets &c.

The mayor appointed J. C. Clevinger and Alex Elliott to inspect street cleaner and such machinery as Mel McCay, former street cleaner, owns and recommend price for same.

J. C. Clevinger moved that a committee be appointed to purchase horses for the fire wagon, and to purchase a lot on which to keep the machinery of the town and to erect a building thereon; and to sell the property on Division street back of the railroad, now owned by the

town, and to apply the proceeds of the sale of same on the purchase of the other lot, and to secure the services of some reliable man to take charge of the street cleaning etc." Alex Elliott seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, yes; Alex Elliott, yes; F. P. Damon, yes; H. E. Syck, yes; W. P. Call, now absent. As all present voted "yes", the mayor declared said motion carried.

The mayor appointed H. E. Syck, F. P. Damon and A. L. Ratliff to carry out and enforce the above order or motion.

J. C. Clevinger moved that the expenses incurred in purchasing those fire wagon, team and other fire apparatus be be paid with first taxes collected for year 1919, and that the first taxes collected be applied for that purpose. Alex Elliott seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, yes; Alex Elliott, yes; F. P. Damon, yes; H. E. Syck, yes; W. P. Call, absent. The mayor declared same carried.

It is ordered that N. Starkley open up the alley or street back of his property in West Pikeville for public use.

Ordered that

E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$75<sup>00</sup> as salary as chief of police for month of April, 1919.

Ordered that

A. L. Ratliff be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$50<sup>00</sup> for salary as city attorney for month of April, 1919.

Ordered that

W. W. Reynolds be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$60<sup>00</sup> for salary as police judge for April, 1919.

Ordered that

W. W. Reynolds be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$25<sup>00</sup> for clerk hire for police judge's office for April, 1919.

Ordered that

E. M. Thornbury be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$90<sup>00</sup> for salary as deputy policeman for April, 1919.

Mel McCay be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$140<sup>00</sup> for cleaning streets of city etc as per contract for

to the other.

to be made at the exclusive cost of the owners of  
real estate abutting on side improvements, as provided
