At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville held in the city hall on the 19th day of May, 1919, the following were present: Mayor, J. F. Morgan, and Councilmen, N. E. Syck, F. P. Damon, Alex Elliott and J. C. Clevinger.

upon motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried Council appointed James Edwards, Grant Phillips and L. J. May as the Board of Supervisors for the city for the year, 1919.

upon motion made, duly seconded and carried unanimously Council elected W. P. Fuller as special policeman for the city of Pikeville.

upon motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried Council hired Anse Owen to care for the horses owned by the city, clean the streets, take care of fire hose and

flush water plugs etc for the period of one year from this date at a salary of \$110.00 per month.

Ordered that
Mel McCay be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$72.65, as follows: one broom sold town, \$31.00, for cleaning streets with team 20 hours, \$15.00; for working city team 36 hours, \$14.40; help, 35 hours, \$12.25.

Ordered that
Mel McCay be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$23.33 for five days work in May, 1919, for cleaning streets etc, which is in full to date and expiration of said contract.

Ordered that
W. W. Reynolds be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$8.44 for 56# sulphuric acid, \$3.36; 1 carboy, \$3.00; express and drayage, \$2.08, for town and paid by W. W. Reynolds.

Ordered that
J. C. Clevinger be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$89.47, as follows: For express on 600 ft hose, \$18.98; freight on fire wagon, \$15.14; and expenses on trip made by said Clevinger to purchase fire equipment for town, \$55.31.

upon motion made, duly seconded and carried a resolution was adopted for the improvement of the following streets in the city of Pikeville, by grading, excavating, setting concrete curbs and gutters, paving the roadway with vitrified brick and combined concrete gutter with four inch concrete base:

- Clive street from the terminus of the present paving to the Coal Hollow.
- Ampier Avenue from the C. D. O. crossing to the intersection with Kentucky Avenue;
- Kentucky Avenue, from the intersection with Ampier Avenue to the intersection with Elm Street at present pavement to the Happy Hollow.
- Hibbard Street, from the present pavement to the southern property line of Anna Lida Call.
- Williamson Avenue, from Hibbard Street to Park Street
- Park Street, the entire length from one terminus to the other.

Said improvement of the above named streets to be made at the exclusive cost of the owners of real estate abutting on said improvements, as provided

South College Street from its present pavement to the Happy Hollow.
