At a regular meeting of the Board of Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall on the 4th day of August, 1919, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan and councilmen, F. P. Damon, Alex Elliott, J. C. Clevinger and W. P. Call.

The minutes of the meetings of July 7th, July 14th, July 21st and July 28th, 1919, were read and approved.

J. C. Clevinger introduced an ordinance entitled an ordinance accepting certain streets in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, which streets are North Clinch Street, Kentucky Avenue, High Street, South College Street, Williamson Street and Park Street, and moved that same be passed, W. P. Call seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, yes; W. P. Call, yes; Alex Elliott, yes; and F. P. Damon, yes. The Mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance passed.

M. F. P. Damon introduced the following resolution and moved the adoption thereof, to wit:

"Resolution.

Section no. 1.

Be It Resolved by the Board of Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, that the following

streets and parts of streets in the city of Pikeville be improved by grading, excavating, setting concrete curbs, and gutters and paving the roadway with vitrified paving, brick and combined curb and gutter with six inch concrete base;

Cline street from the terminus of the present paving to the Coal Hollow;

Auxier Avenue from the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway crossing to the intersection of Kentucky Avenue;

Kentucky Avenue from the intersection of Auxier Avenue to the intersection with Elm Street at the present pavement;

South College Street from its present pavement to Nappy Hollow;

Williamson Avenue from Hibbard Street to Park Street;

Park Street the entire length from one terminus to the other;

High Street from Auxier Avenue to Kentucky Avenue;

It is hereby declared by the Board of Council that the proposed improvement above described is a necessity.

The said improvement shall be done in accordance with Kentucky Statute, Sections 3561 to 3578, inclusive, as amended by Chapter 113 of the Acts of 1916 of the General Assembly of Kentucky.

Said improvement shall be done upon the ten year bond plan at the exclusive cost of the owners of lots and parcels of lots or land fronting, bordering or abutting on said improvement.

Section 110.2.

This resolution shall be published in one issue of the newspaper published in Pike County at least thirty days before the ordinance ordering said improvement shall pass the board of council, at any time prior to the final passage of the ordinance ordering the improvement as hereinbefore resolved to be a necessity, the owner or owners of more than fifty percent of the abutting property may file a written petition designating the material to be used in the construction of that part of the improvement for which the abutting property will be liable or may file a written protest against the improvement.

The city attorney is hereby ordered to cause this resolution to be published as herein provided, and after the expiration of thirty days from such publication,

the city attorney shall report in writing to the board of council the fact of such publication and file a copy of such advertisement to be copied by the clerk in the minutes of the board of council.

The motion to adopt the above resolution was duly seconded by W. P. Call, upon roll call the vote was as follows; F. P. Damon, yes; W. P. Call, yes; Alex Elliott, yes; J. C. Clevinger, yes; W. E. Syck, absent, and G. F. Childers, absent.

The mayor declared same carried.

J. C. Clevinger moved that the ordinance entitled "an ordinance adopting an ordinance and Resolution for improvement of sidewalks" as designated and described in Resolution passed at the meeting of the City Council on June 2nd, 1919, and ordinance passed July 17th, 1919, be re-adopted and re-passed. W. P. Call seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows; J. C. Clevinger, yes; W. P. Call, yes; F. P. Damon, yes; Alex Elliott, yes; W. E. Syck, absent; G. F. Childers, absent. The mayor declared same carried.
