At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 28th day of November, 1919 the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, W. P. Call, Alex. Elliott, W. E. Syck and F. P. Dameron.

Ordered that Call Brothers Hardware Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$497.21 for merchandise account in full from May 24, 1918, up to and including November 14, 1919.

Ordered that Stong Amick be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$103.10 for work on streets, sidewalks and expenses and help for city during September and October, 1919.

Ordered that E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$75.00 for salary as chief of police for October, 1919.

Ordered that G. L. Kattig be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$50.00 for salary as city attorney for month of October, 1919.

Ordered that E. M. Thombury be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$90.00 for salary as deputy policeman for October, 1919.

Ordered that W. W. Reynolds be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$60.00 for salary as police judge for October, 1919.

Ordered that W. W. Reynolds be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$25.00 for clerk hire for police judge's office for October, 1919.

F. P. Dameron moved that the contract between Lida E. Kellier and the city of Pikeville for the rental of barn for city's use be confirmed, accepted and approved, which contract has heretofore been signed by Lida E. Kellier and approved by J. L. Morgan, Mayor, and that the city pay her \$99.00, expenses incurred in fixing said barn; said contract being as follows:

"This contract made and entered into by and between Lida E. Kellier, of Pikeville, Ky., party of the first part, and the city of Pikeville, party of the second part;

Witnesseth; that the said first party and the second party do hereby contract with each other as follows:

- I. Said first party has this, the 28th day of November, 1919, leased to the second party one barn on corner of Huffman Street and eastern side of South Kellier Street, in Pikeville, Ky., for purpose of keeping city's fire apparatus, for a period of one year, with the privilege of five years, the period of five years ending on November 28th, 1924, for the sum of five (\$5.00) dollars per month, the same to be paid at the end of each respective rental year, until the expiration of this lease, and in default of the yearly payment, this contract shall become null and void.
- II. Said second party is to reimburse first party for monies she has spent on repairs on building, as per agreement of city Council, and is to keep the building in repair hereafter at city's cost.
- III. Said second party is to have use of driveway around barn in the lot on which the barn stands.
- IV. Said first party is to have preference of the offal from the barn.

M., in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, at the Clinic crossing on Division Street, be reported to the Superintendent of the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company and its attorneys, in which accident an automobile driven by John G. Sowards and occupied by said Sowards Mrs. J. R. Thompson, Mrs. J. J. Christel, Mrs. G. J. Baldwin and others, ^{was} struck by a loose car and knocked several feet; there being no flagman at the crossing to notify persons that cars were being switched, same being a public crossing and the traveling public's sight being obstructed. The said train switching on said track was train no. 90, according to this council's information.
