Baldwin and others ^{was} struck by a loose car and knocked several feet; there being no flagman at the crossing to notify persons that cars were being switched same being a public crossing and the traveling public's sight being obstructed. The said train switching on said track was train No. 90, according to this council's information.

E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$223⁴² for collecting \$2570²⁸ city taxes for year 1919, being 10% commission on \$1897⁹⁶, \$189⁸⁰; and 5% on \$622³², \$33⁶².

Ordered that

Robert Williams be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$63³¹ for feed &c for city's team from and including November 3rd up to and including November 30, 1919, \$54⁸¹; and stall rent and storage for wagon, \$8⁵⁰.

Ordered that

J. P. Morris be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$61⁸⁰ for keeping and dieting city's prisoners from August 8, 1919, to November 4, 1919, \$51⁰⁰; and releasing and committing city prisoners, \$10⁸⁰.

This day came A. E. Auxier, agent for Mrs. Elizabeth Auxier, and produced and had filed protest against construction of sidewalk ordered to be built by city abutting property owned by Mrs. Elizabeth Auxier, and published in the "Pike County News," for the reasons therein set forth.

S. M. Heriford moved that Frank Forsythe and Dr. John Atkins be appointed as street committee for city of Pikeville, George Coleman seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Arnich & Hayes be and they are hereby allowed the sum of \$165⁶⁵ for engineering services, help and expenses relative to new construction in paving streets &c.

Ordered that

Jimmy Carnes be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$110⁰⁰ for cleaning streets &c as per contract for month of November, 1919.

D. L. Francis introduced an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance fixing the salaries of the officers of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the term beginning on the first Monday in January, 1920, and ending first Monday in January, 1921, and repealing other ordinances in conflict therewith," and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted.

George Coleman seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows; D. L. Francis, yes; George Coleman, yes; Dr. John Atkins, yes; Frank Forsythe, yes; T. C. Bus Kirk, yes; S. M. Heriford, yes. The mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance passed and adopted.

E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$75⁰⁰ for salary as chief of police for month of November, 1919.

Ordered that

E. M. Thompson be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$90⁰⁰ for salary as deputy policeman for month of November, 1919.

A. L. Rutledge be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$50⁰⁰ for salary as city attorney for month of November, 1919.
