At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 6th day of December, 1919, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, S. M. Heriford, Frank Horsythe, D. L. Francis, George Coleman and Dr. John Atkins.

S. M. Heriford moved that the city employ C. B. Sterling to audit the city's books in lieu of Joseph Stark at the sum of \$10<sup>00</sup> per day and expenses; Dr. John Atkins seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: S. M. Heriford, yes; Dr. John Atkins, yes; Frank Horsythe, yes; D. L. Francis, yes;

George Coleman, yes. The mayor declared said motion carried.

Deputy policeman, E. M. Thompson, tendered his written resignation as deputy policeman, which is in words and figures as follows:

The city clerk's settlement with the chief of police for month of November, 1919, which showed \$46<sup>20</sup> collected by him on copies pro fines, and \$2570<sup>78</sup>, tags was filed, accepted and approved.

E. M. Hickory be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$15<sup>00</sup> for salary as deputy policeman for five days in month of December, 1919, which is in full to date.
