At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the city hall in Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 11th day of December, 1919, the following were present: J. beginning first Monday in January, 1920, and ending first Monday in January, 1922, Dr. John Atkins seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: S.M. Heriford, yes; Dr. John Atkins, yes; J.C. Bushkin, yes; Frank Forsythe, yes; George Coleman, yes; D.L. Francis, absent. The mayor declared said motion carried and said another voted for the above term.

At a ~~regular~~ meeting of the board of council for the City of Pikeville, Ky held at the City Hall in said City 15th day of Dec. 1919 pursuant of call regular signed by the Mayor of the City for the purpose of accepting resignation of E.P. Coffey C.P. and for the further purpose of appointing Chief of Police to fill the vacancy and for the further purpose of electing Policeman for the remainder of the term ending first Monday Jan. 1920. There was present the following members of City Council: J.H. Morgan Mayor, Dr. ~~John~~ Atkins - D.L. Francis - G.W. Coleman - S.M. Heriford - Frank Forsythe - J.C. Bushkin Absent.

Upon motion of Dr. John Atkins duly seconded by James M. Heriford, the resignation of E.P. Coffey as Chief of Police was unanimously accepted, and the office of Chief Police thereby declared Vacant.

The Mayor thereupon declared said A.J. Potter elected Chief of Police of Pikeville Ky. for the unexpired term ending first Monday in January 1920. Approved.

A.J. Potter appeared before the City Council and agreed as ~~bondsmen~~ ^{for Mayor} for Chief of Police. The United States Fidelity & Guaranty Co. of Balti. Md. said bond being in words and figures as follows - We, A.J. Potter Principal and the United States Fidelity & Guaranty Co. of Balti. Md. Sureties are held and firmly bound under the Commonwealth of Kentucky for the use and benefit of the City of Pikeville. Ky. in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5000⁰⁰) Dollars in lawfull money of America for the payment of which, we all and truly to be made, we bind ourselves our heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Sealed and dated this the 15th day of Dec. 1919.

Whereas the above Bondsmen, A.J. Potter has been appointed Chief of Police for the City of Pikeville Ky.

Now therefore the conditions of this obligation is such that if he said A.J. Potter shall from the 15th day of Dec. 1919 to Dec. 15th 1920 well and faithfully perform all the duties of his said office ^{according to the best of his ability} then his obligation is to us, otherwise to remain in full force and effect and if he fail to perform any of his said duties we will forfeit and pay to the Commonwealth of Kentucky for the use and benefit of
