Stratton moved introduction of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance fixing the license tax on street carnivals exhibiting or showing in the City of Pikeville," which ordinance fixed the license fee for said carnivals at \$150⁰⁰ per day, and moved that said ordinance be passed. D. L. Francis seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: P. B. Stratton, yes; D. L. Francis, yes; John Adkins, yes; J. C. Bushkill, absent; Frank Harrythe, absent; George Coleman, absent; J. L. Morgan, yes. The Mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance passed.

John Adkins offered the following and moved the adoption and passage of same.

"Be it enacted by the Common Council assembled in the city hall as aforesaid that the city ordinance heretofore enacted and posted on the 16th day of August, 1920, increasing the license fee for street carnivals from \$25⁰⁰ to \$150⁰⁰ per day be, and the same is hereby repealed in so far as same is made effective upon the posting thereof, and there is hereby enacted in lieu of said clause the following:

"That the said ordinance shall be effective on and after the 23rd day of August, 1920. This act shall become effective upon being duly signed by the mayor and clerk and posted as required by law."

Frank Harrythe seconded said motion, and the vote being called for upon the passage of said ordinance the following vote was had: John Adkins, yes; Frank Harrythe, yes; George Coleman, no; P. B. Stratton, no; D. L. Francis, yes; J. C. Bushkill, absent. The mayor declared said motion carried.

Whereupon the mayor vetoed said motion and ordinance by writing thereon the following:
