John A. McCowan moved that said report of acceptance of said streets be received, approved and accepted and spread at large on the minute book. John Atkins seconded said motion. Kelly Brothers having presented a certificate signed by the street committee accepting and approving the paving of Clin Street, Kentucky Avenue, High Street, South College Street, Williamson Avenue and Park Street as having been done according to contract, thereupon it was ordered by the Council that the said paving of the said streets be accepted and approved as having been done according to contract.

John Atkins seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows; John A. McCowan, yes; John Atkins, yes; Fred Repass, yes; J. C. Buskirk, yes; Frank J. John Atkins introduced a resolution entitled "A Resolution Providing for the improvement of certain streets in the city of Pikeville," which streets are as follows; Cline Street from the present paving at the coal Hollow Crossing to the Railway Crossing at or near the Poor Farm Branch Crossing; Steele Street from its intersection with Cline Street to its intersection with River View Drive; River View Drive from its intersection with Steele Street to its intersection with Cline Street; Myra Barnes Avenue from its intersection with Steele Street to its intersection with Cline Street; Sycamore Street from its intersection with High Street to its intersection with Elm Street; Scott Avenue from its intersection with Second Street to eastern extremity thereof; Second Street from the present paving to its northern extremity thereof; Third Street from the present paving to the northern extremity thereof; Fourth Street from the present paving to the northern extremity thereof; Fifth Street from its intersection with Cline Street to the northern extremity thereof; Sixth Street from the present paving to the northern extremity thereof. At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 29th day of December, 1920, the following were present: Mayor, J. E. Childers, and councilman, Frank J. Forsythe, George Coleman, John Adkins and Fred Repass.

Mayor Childers presented to the Board of Council the written statement filed with him December 20, 1920, by the

City Engineer, showing completion of work, estimate of cost, apportionment and other data relative to improvement of Clinch Street and other streets and parts of streets under ordinance and adopted September 10, 1919, and re-adopted September 22, 1919.

Mr. Frank Forsythe moved that said written statement be received and filed, motion was recorded by Mr. George Coleman, upon roll call the motion was carried by the following vote: Frank Forsythe, yes; George Coleman, yes; Fred Repass, yes; John Adkins, yes; J. C. Buskirk, absent; John A. McCowan, absent.

Mr. Frank Forsythe presented to the Board of Council the joint written report of the Street Committee of the Board of Council and the Board of Public Works showing that the City Engineer had filed with them on December 20th, 1920, his written statement showing completion of work, estimate of cost, apportionment and other data relative to improvement of Clinch Street and other streets and parts of streets under ordinance adopted September 10th, 1919, and re-adopted September 22nd, 1919, the giving of notice by said Street Committee and Board of Public Works of time and place fixed for inspection and reception of said work and the acceptance of same and approval of estimate of cost.

Mr. Forsythe moved that said joint written report be received and confirmed and made part of the minute of this meeting, motion was seconded by Mr. George Coleman, on roll call the motion was carried by the following vote: Frank Forsythe, yes; George Coleman, yes; Fred Repass, yes; John Adkins, yes; J. C. Buskirk, absent; John A. McCowan, absent.

Said report is in words and figures as follows: "Pikeville, Kentucky, December 29, 1920. To the Honorable Board of Council, Pikeville, Kentucky: Gentlemen:

The undersigned, constituting respectively the Street Committee of your honorable board, and the Board of Public Works of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, do report: That on December 20th, 1920, Mr. Honey Amick, City Engineer of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, did file with the undersigned a written statement regarding street improvement work under authority of ordinance of your honorable board adopted September 10th, 1919, and re-adopted September 22nd, 1919, which written statement shows,

Among other things, that said improvement work had been completed by Kelley Brothers, contractors, in accordance with said ordinance and their contract with the city; that the full and correct estimate of the total cost of said work was eighty thousand eight hundred seventy-two & 38/100 dollars (\$80,872³⁸); that the number of fronting or abutting feet of lands and property was 17,705⁹ feet; that the cost per abutting foot was \$4,417² per foot on Cline Street; and \$4,484⁸ per foot on Lupin Avenue, Kentucky Avenue, South College Street, Williamson Avenue, Park Street and High Street (the city having withdrawn the improvement of Hibbard Street); that the part of the cost payable by the city was \$17,146⁶⁶, and that the part of the cost assessable against the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company was \$20,184¹⁹; and that the part of the cost assessable to abutting property owners was \$79,157²², including the aforesaid assessment of the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company, which \$79,157²² was apportioned by said City Engineer to abutting lands and properties as shown in detail in his said written statement, according to the number of feet of lands and property belonging to each individual abutting owner as shown in said written statement.

The undersigned thereupon inserted notice in the issue of the Pike County News of December 24th, 1920, of the fixing of December 29th, 1920, at one o'clock P.M., at the City Hall, Pikeville, Kentucky, as the time and place of hearing as to inspection and reception of said improvement work, said the Pike County News being a newspaper printed, published and of general circulation in said City of Pikeville, and in Pike County, Kentucky, the undersigned having received no objections to the acceptance of said work, nor to the estimate or apportionment of the cost thereof as made by said City Engineer, and having inspected said work and finding same in accordance with the contract and Ordinance therefor, did accept the same.

George Coleman presented and introduced an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance accepting the street improvement work provided for in an ordinance of the City of Pikeville adopted September 10th, 1919, and re-adopted September 22nd, 1919, for the improvement of Cline Street and other streets and parts of streets in said Ordinance named; confirming the engineer's estimate of cost of said improvement; apportioning the cost of said improvement work; and assessing and levying a tax on and against the several lots and parcels of land and property abutting said improvement to produce the part of the cost of said improvement apportioned to such abutting lots and parcels of lands and property."

George Coleman moved that said ordinance be adopted. motion was seconded by John Adkins. on roll call the motion was carried by the following vote; George Coleman, yes; John Adkins, yes; Fred Repass, yes; Frank Forsythe, yes; J. C. Buskirk, absent; John A. McCowan, absent.

It appearing that the city engineer has reported the amount of street paving due from J. S. Cline for 6195 feet at extreme terminus of Cline Street, and apportionment warrant issued for \$2736⁴⁶. and it appearing that said Cline has paid same in full to Kelley Brothers, the contractors, it is ordered that lien for street paving be released, and the city clerk is directed to satisfy same on the Apportionment Warrant Book kept for that purpose.

upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.
