

at a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 2nd day of March 1921, the following were present: Councilmen, Fred Repass, John Adkins, George Coleman, Frank J. Forsythe and T. C. Buskirk.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried John Adkins was elected mayor pro tem.

L. L. Stone, chief of the Fire Department, filed his report of inspection of all buildings within the fire district as set forth by Ordinances.

George Coleman moved that the report of L. L. Stone be accepted, and that a committee be appointed and make such recommendations as they see fit. Frank J. Forsythe seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

The mayor pro tem appointed as members of the above committee, Frank J. Forsythe and John A. McCaway.

Martel Collinsworth, together with John F. Phillips and R. L. Sparks, his sureties, and signed bond and acceptance of same required in resolution passed and adopted February 15, 1921, granting Martel Collinsworth the right to occupy building which is a part of old Williamson House, located on Williamson House lot, between Main and Second Streets until November 1st, 1921; said bond setting forth that in the event said building is not removed by said time, that the said Martel Collinsworth, John F. Phillips and R. L. Sparks shall forfeit and pay to the Commonwealth of Kentucky for the use and benefit of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, the sum of \$2500.00.

Petition was filed, which was signed by various citizens, asking that the city open up and make a street out of the alley between Third and Fourth Streets from Scott Avenue to the river,

upon motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried, Council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 15th day of March 1921, the following were present: Mayor, J. E. Childers, and Councilmen, Frank J. Forsythe, Fred Repass and John Adkins.

John Adkins introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance establishing April 4th to April 10th, 1921, as clean-up period for the city of Pikeville, Kentucky," and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Fred Repass seconded said motion, upon roll call said motion carried by the following vote: John Adkins, yes; Fred Repass, yes; Frank J. Forsythe, yes; T. C. Buskirk absent; John A. McCaway, absent; George Coleman, absent.

Ordered that

Arnold & Haynes be and they are hereby allowed the sum of \$5.00 for engineering services relating to street assessment work during month of February, 1921.

Ordered that

J. H. Huffman Coal Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$5.00 for one load of coal for city as per bid dated March 29, 1921.

Fred Repass introduced an ordinance entitled "Curfew Ordinance", and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Frank J. Forsythe seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: Fred Repass, yes; Frank J. Forsythe, yes; John Adkins, yes; T. C. Buskirk absent; John A. McCaway, absent; George Coleman, absent. The mayor declared said ordinance passed and adopted.

It appearing that there were no bids received by the city for the construction of street paving under ordinance herein, including Elm Street and various other streets, of date January 29th, 1921, and February 15th, 1921, upon motion of John Adkins, duly seconded by Fred Repass, and unanimously carried, It is further ordered by the council that the mayor, treasurer and city clerk readvertise said street paving fully complying with the terms of said ordinance and will receive bids up to and including April 12th, 1921, 7:30 P.M.

John Adkins introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance creating and defining a sewer district for the south end of the city of Pikeville and providing for the construction of a sewer system for said district and creating a levy

against the property in said district for the cost of same" and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Frank J. Fioreytha seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; Frank J. Fioreytha, yes; Fred Repass, yes; John A. McCowan, absent; T. C. Bushirk, absent; George Coleman, absent. The mayor declared said ordinance passed and adopted. (The following minute marked "X" is a minute of meeting of February 15, 1921, page 441.)

"X" John Atkins introduced and moved the final adoption of an ordinance for the improvement of

(1) Elm Street from the present paving at Coal Hollow Crossing to the railway crossing at or near the County Farm Branch Crossing;

(2) State Street from its intersection with Elm Street to its intersection with River View Drive;

(3) River View Drive from its intersection with State Street to its intersection with Elm Street;

(4) Myra Barnes Avenue from its intersection with State Street to its intersection with Elm Street;

(5) Sycamore Street from its intersection with High Street, to its intersection with Elm Street;

(6) Scott Avenue from its intersection with Second Street to the River Bank or east end thereof;

(7) Second Street from the present paving to north end thereof;

(8) Third Street from the present paving to the northern extremity or end thereof;

(9) Fourth Street from the present paving to the northern extremity or end thereof;

(10) Fifth Street from the intersection with Elm Street to the northern extremity or end thereof;

(11) Sixth Street from the present paving to the northern extremity or end thereof.

By paving same with concrete base and vitrified paving brick, which ordinance having been passed, adopted and published by this Board of Council on the 29th day of January, 1921, and ten days having intervened, said ordinance is therefore declared finally passed and adopted and ordered published as other ordinances. Said motion being seconded by George Coleman, on roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; George Coleman, yes; T. C. Bushirk, yes; Frank J. Fioreytha, yes; Fred Repass, yes; John A. McCowan, absent. The mayor thereupon declared same passed.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.
