McCowan moved that the Standard Oil Company be compelled or granted permit with the provision that a building be erected in which to keep all barrels, refuse &c. and the premises to be kept clean and in first class condition at all times. Pikeville Electric Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$15⁰⁰ for one 150 Watt lamp for city hall.

ordered that

Eastern Kentucky Home Telephone Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$6⁰⁰ for telephone service from April 1st to July 1st, 1921.

L.H. Whitman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$96⁸⁰ for help for cleaning streets &c during March, 1921.

Williams Feed Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$28²¹ for feed for city's team for month of March, 1921.

John Atkins introduced a resolution entitled "A Resolution granting George Hanes a temporary permit to remove a wood building and use same until his new building is completed," and moved that said resolution be passed and adopted, where and after said Hanes executes bond as

required and set forth in said resolution, Frank Forsythe seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; Frank Forsythe, yes; Fred Repass, John A. McCowan, yes; J. C. Bushkin, absent; George Coleney, absent.

Fred Repass introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance providing for a city license tax on live stock sales and sales stable and providing a penalty for violation thereof," and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. John A. McCowan seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: Fred Repass, yes; John A. McCowan, yes; John Atkins, yes; Frank Forsythe, yes; J. C. Bushkin, absent; George Coleney, absent. Said ordinance carried.

John A. Bentley filed bid for construction of side walks here-tofore advertised, which is as follows:

Bentley (copied above) be accepted for the building of side walks, which walks have heretofore been advertised, when contract attached thereto is executed between the city of Pikeville and said John A. Bentley. John A. McCowan seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; John A. McCowan, yes; Fred Repass, yes; Frank Forsythe, yes; George Coleney, absent; J. C. Bushkin, absent. Said motion carried.

John Atkins introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance prohibiting stock running at large in city of Pikeville, and providing a penalty for violation thereof," and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Fred Repass seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; Fred Repass, yes; Frank Forsythe, yes; John A. McCowan, yes; J. C. Bushkin, absent; George Coleney, absent. Said motion carried.

John Atkins moved that city clerk's settlements with police judge and chief of police for months of February and March 1921, and April, 1921, be accepted filed and approved. Frank Forsythe seconded said motion, which

carried unanimously.

A. L. Rutledge be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$50⁰⁰ for salary as city attorney for month of April, 1921.

Ordered that

James Motney be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$135⁰⁰ for salary as chief of police for month of April, 1921.

J. M. Fletcher be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$35⁵⁰ for salary, ^{and services} as city clerk for month of April, 1921.

Ordered that

Buster Bales be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$100⁰⁰ for salary as policeman for month of April, 1921, less \$25⁰⁰ to be applied on debt owing city by said Bales, said salary being \$75⁰⁰ per month.

Ordered that

L. H. Whittemore be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$150⁰⁰ for salary as street cleaner for month of April, 1921.
