

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville Kentucky held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 7th day of June, 1921, the following were present:
Mayor, J. E. Childers and councilmen, Fred Repass, John Atkins and Frank Forseythe.

Ordered that

Williams Feed Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$24³¹ for feed for city's team for month of May, 1921.

Ordered that

S.G. Adams Stamp & Stationery Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$3³² for dog tags for city for year 1920.

Ordered that

Cumberland Publishing Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$16²⁵ for printing ad and tax notices for city as per bill of May 30, 1921.

John Atkins introduced a resolution entitled "A Resolution providing for the construction of sidewalks on West side of Main Street" and moved that said resolution be passed and adopted. Fred Repass seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; Fred Repass, yes; Frank Forseythe, yes; J.C. Buskirk, absent; George Coleman, absent; John A. McCowan, absent; The mayor declared said resolution passed and adopted.

John Atkins introduced an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance providing for the election of all city officers by the qualified voters of the city", and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Frank Forseythe seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; Frank Forseythe, yes; Fred Repass, yes; George Coleman, absent; John A. McCowan, absent; J.C. Buskirk, absent. The mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance passed and adopted.

Ordered that

J. N. Robinson be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$20⁰⁰ for inspecting building of sidewalks for city during months of May and June, 1921.

Ordered that

Arnold Hayes be and they are hereby allowed the sum of \$274²⁰ for engineering services in connection with sewerage in South Pikeville for months of April and May, 1921.

Ordered that

L. H. Whitman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$76³⁰ for help for cleaning streets &c during month of May, 1921.

Councilman, John A. McCowan now present.

John Atkins moved that the street back of residence of Mrs. W. Hartley, known as Short Street, be located by the city engineer. Fred Repass seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: John Atkins, yes; Fred Repass, yes; John A. McCowan, yes; Frank Forseythe, yes; J.C. Buskirk, absent; George Coleman, absent.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried city clerk statements with police judge and chief of police for month of May are filed, accepted and approved.

Ordered that

G. L. Ratcliff be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$50⁰⁰ for salary as city attorney for month of May, 1921.

Ordered that

Butter Baker be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$125⁰⁰ for salary as policeman for month of May, 1921.

Ordered that

James Motney be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$135⁰⁰ for salary as chief of police for month of May, 1921.

Ordered that

J. M. Fletcher be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$125⁰⁰ for salary for month of May, 1921, as city clerk, \$41⁰⁰ and getting out 260 street paving notices and postage, October, 1920.

Ordered that

L. H. Whitman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$150⁰⁰ for salary as street cleaner for month of May, 1921.

Ordered that

W. W. Reynolds be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$60⁰⁰ as salary as police judge for month of May, 1921.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried, Council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.
