Ordered that

H. E. Sykes be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$10.00 for serving on board of superintendents for year 1921, 5 days @ \$2.00.

Ordered that

W. E. McCay be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$15.65 for work and material for repairing paving on Fourth Street, in front of Brown Scotts store during February, 1922.

Ordered that

The bond of W. P. Dawson for the collection of (old) city school taxes was presented to the council, which is in words and figures as follows:

We, W. P. Dawson, principal, and Martin Collisworth and D.C. Bumlee, Jr., sureties undertake that said W. P. Dawson shall account for and pay over to the proper authorities all city school taxes collected by him, and if he fail to account for and pay over same according to law, we will forfeit and pay to the city of Pikeville any sum so he should fail to account for, not exceeding the sum of one thousand dollars.

It appearing that A.J. Hatcher here were taxed for year 1919 the sum of \$36.62 for city school taxes on property which they had sold to T.G. Williamson and which taxes T.G. Williamson paid, John A. McCowan moved that A.J. Hatcher be exonerated from the payment of same, R.H. Lyons seconded said motion, which carried.

Ordered that

R.L. Sparks be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$187.60 for work in fencing street and money paid out for having same done, and for putting in sewerage on street running from Heller Street to Sycamore Street above electrical repair shop, same being done in year 1920.

R.H. Lyons moved that Charley Blow, street cleaner, be allowed to work at other jobs when the weather is so he cannot work on the streets. Rush Sward seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

A.L. Radliff be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$50.00 for salary as city attorney for month of February, 1922, as of March 7, 1922.

Ordered that

Charley Blow be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$120.00 for salary as street cleaner for month of February, 1922, (\$25.00 deducted from salary of \$145.00 for horse, wagon &c.), as of March 7, 1922.

Ordered that

James Matney be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$135.00 for salary as chief of police for month of February, 1922, as of March 7, 1922.

Ordered that

Butler Balter be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$125.00 for salary as deputy policeman for month of February, 1922.

Ordered that

Wm. Hatcher be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$44.25 for salary and services as city clerk for month of February, 1922.

Ordered that

J.B. Marrs be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$60.00 for salary as police judge for month of February, 1922.

Ordered that

J.B. Marrs be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$40.00 for clerk hire for police judge's office for month of February, 1922.

The minutes of the meeting of March 21, 1922, were read and approved.

John A. McCowan introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance authorizing the closing of the north end of Main Street north of the intersection of Scott Avenue and Main Street near the ridge known as "the Lower Hard", and providing for the improving of that part of Main Street between northern intersecting line of Scott Avenue and Main Street and the south line of Dr. G.H. Hughes connecting with the present paving", and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. R.H. Lyons seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: John A. McCowan, yes; R.H. Lyons, yes; E.M. Hatfield, yes; Walter Hatcher, absent; Carl Young, absent; Rush Sward, absent. Said motion carried.

John A. McCowan introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance giving Fire Department right-of-way in case of fire, making it the duty of all persons operating motor vehicles on street to yield said vehicles, making it unlawful for any person to drive any motor vehicle wagon or other instrument over the fire hose or other implement connected with the fire department used in extinguishing fires", and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted.
