At a regular meeting of the common council of the city of Pottsville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pottsville, Kentucky, on the 5th day of September, 1922, the following were present: Councilmen, J. S. Cline, Carl Young, R. H. Lyons and E. M. Hatfield.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried J. S. Cline was elected mayor pro tem.

At a regular meeting of the common council of the city of Pottsville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pottsville, Kentucky, on the 3rd day of October 1922, the following were present: Mayor, J. S. Cline, and councilmen, John A. McCowan, E. M. Hatfield, J. S. Cline and R. H. Lyons.

The minute of the meeting of September 5th were read and approved.

John A. McCowan moved that T. H. Deskins, J. E. Sanders and Ben Dawson be appointed as members of the Board of Supervisors of the city of Pikeville for the year 1922. E. M. Hatfield seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Ben Dawson, J. E. Sanders and T. H. Deskins appeared in open council and took the oath as members of Board of Supervisors for the year 1922 as required by law.

John A. McCowan moved that all parking ordinances be repealed. E. M. Hatfield seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: John A. McCowan, yes; E. M. Hatfield, yes; R. H. Lyons, yes; J. S. Cline, yes; Carl Young, absent; Rush Sward, absent. Said motion carried.

John A. McCowan moved that W. T. Phillips be exonerated from payment of the sum of \$2500⁰⁰ on his city and school taxes for the year 1921. J. S. Cline seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

J. S. Cline introduced an ordinance entitled "Street Paving Ordinance" for the pavement of Caroline Avenue, and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. John A. McCowan seconded said motion. The above ordinance for the improvement of Caroline Avenue by brick paving and concrete base having been duly passed by said Council, as shown by the "Aye" and "Nay" vote above, the same having been advertised in the Pike County news according to law more than thirty days before the passage hereof, it is now ordered that said ordinance be passed for future passage for a term of ten days.

J. S. Cline introduced an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance prohibiting tapping or connecting with the city sewers or excavating under any street, alley or other public property or placing any building material on any street without a permit so to do" and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Said motion carried and said ordinance passed.

J. S. Cline introduced a form of permit entitled "Permit to excavate under the street or to tap and connect a private sewer line with the city sewer or to place building material on street" and moved that same be adopted. John A. McCowan seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

J. S. Cline moved that the city attorney give any one maintaining a nuisance in the corporate limits of the city of Pikeville a notice to abate same within five days, and if not abated, to take legal steps provided by law. John A. McCowan seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

J. S. Cline introduced an ordinance intitled "An ordinance for the improvement of sidewalks", which ordinance was for the improvement of sidewalks on College Street, Hubbard Street, Cline Street and Alpine Avenue, and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. John A. McCowan seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, yes; John A. McCowan, yes; E. M. Hatfield, yes; R. H. Lyons, yes; Carl Young, absent; Rush Sward, absent. Said motion carried and said ordinance passed.

The above ordinance for the improvement of sidewalks along above named streets having been duly passed by said Council, as shown by the "Aye" and "Nay" vote above the same having been advertised in the Pike County news according to law, more than thirty days before the passage hereof, it is now ordered that said ordinance be passed for future passage for a term of ten days.

A certified copy of an order intitled "Order reducing the school tax levy from ninety cents on the one hundred dollars to seventy-five cents for year 1922" was produced by the Pikeville Board of Education and read to the City Council. J. S. Cline moved that same be adopted. John A. McCowan seconded, which was carried unanimously.

Communication having been received from the Board of Education of the city of Pikeville setting out the fact seventy-five cents on the one hundred dollars would be sufficient for school purposes for this year, it is therefore ordered by said City Council that the levy be reduced from ninety cents to seventy-five cents on each one hundred dollars taxable property.

It appearing that L. H. Whitman street cleaner, has quit said work John A. McCowan moved that the city enter into written contract with Charles Helvey to do said street cleaning which contract sets forth that said Helvey is to devote his whole time to said work and faithfully comply with the terms of said contract to the sum of \$200⁰⁰ per month. J. S. Cline seconded motion, which carried unanimously. Written contract was produced in open council and signed by Charles Helvey and J. L. Morgan, mayor, attested by J. M. Hartree, city clerk.

J. S. Cline moved that the Dandy Valley Light & Power Company be directed to install five street lights from the corner of Steele Street along Myra Barnes Avenue to Riverside Drive to be placed as follows: one at or near Charley Dyes residence; one at corner of Riverside Drive and Myra Barnes Avenue; one at corner of Steele Street and Myra Barnes Avenue, and two where needed. John A. McCowan seconded said motion, which carried.
