Cline introduced an ordinance authorizing and directing a sale of a franchise for the water works system in and for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and reciting and setting out the terms, requirements and nature of said franchise and water works system. R. H. Lyons seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; R. H. Lyons, yes; Rush Swoord, yes; Carl Young, yes; John A. McCarren, yes; E. M. Hatfield, absent. Said motion carried.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 20th day of February 1923, the following were present: Councilmen, J. S. Cline, E. M. Hatfield, Rush Swoord and Carl Young.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Carl Young was elected mayor pro tem.

J. S. Cline moved that Brooks Auto Company be exonerated from payment of taxes in the sum of \$1800.00; that is, taxes on the sum of \$1800.00, on account of its garage being listed twice by mistake, E. M. Hatfield seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Ordered that

Standard Printing & Publishing Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$47.65 for one file purchased by city for officials during December, 1922.

Ordered that

J. H. Huffman Coal Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$400.00 for one load of coal for police station as per bill of February 12, 1923.

J. S. Cline moved that the ordinance entitled "Street and Alley Paving ordinance" which ordinance was heretofore passed on the 16th day of February, 1923, and which ordinance is for the paving of Park Street and other streets, and alley between Park Street and Hibbard Street and other alleys, be now finally passed and adopted after second reading. E. M. Hatfield seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; E. M. Hatfield, yes; John A. McCarren, absent; Rush Swoord, yes; R. H. Lyons, absent; Carl Young, yes. Said motion carried.

J. S. Cline moved that the streets and alleys that have heretofore been ordered to be paved and failed to be awarded because no bidders and the present street and alley paving passed finally at this meeting be let as set out in said ordinance, and bids be received up until 7:30 o'clock P.M., Saturday, March 10, 1923, and that same be advertised according to law. E. M. Hatfield seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

J. S. Cline moved that all the street paving ordinances heretofore passed and passed at this meeting tonight be divided into three zones; and that all that part of the work in what is known as West Pikeville and Cline Addition below the property of E. J. Picklesimer to the corporate line be known as Zone No. 1; that all of the street and alley paving required under ordinances heretofore passed and passed tonight be located in that part of the city east of the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company track from the property of E. J. Picklesimer to the corporate limits of the city of Pikeville at its southern boundary be known as Zone No. 2; that all that part of the street paving ordered by ordinance heretofore passed and passed at this meeting, situated on the west side of the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company track to the west line of the corporate

limits be known as Zone no 3. That any bidder be given the privilege of bidding for either zone or all of the zones collectively, and the Council or Committee appointed by these ordinances shall have the right to accept a bid on any zone, or all the zones, or reject a bid on one zone and accept a bid on all other zones, not being confined to contracting or letting all the zones to one or the same person or corporation, or at the same time. E. M. Hatfield seconded said motion upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Clive, aye; E. M. Hatfield, yes; John A. McCowan, absent; P. H. Lyons, absent; Rush Sword, yes; Carl Young, yes. Said motion carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried it is ordered that R. O. Howker, City Treasurer, pay to the First National Bank of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the firm of Kelley Brothers the sum of \$2000⁰⁰ for the following (old year 1913) street paving bonds due year 1922:

no. 26, Series A, Contract no. 1, due October 1, 1922,	\$500.00

Said bonds were inspected by the city council and turned by the city treasurer in their presence.

Also, on motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried interest on above bonds to the amount of \$106.32⁰⁰ is allowed First National Bank of Pikeville for Kelley Brothers, by reason of the above four bonds not being paid when due, and the said city treasurer is directed to pay said amount to said bank, which he did in open council.

On motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried it is ordered that R. O. Howker, City Treasurer, pay to the First National Bank of Pikeville, Kentucky, for Kelley Brothers, the sum of \$765.80⁰⁰ for interest unpaid on (old year 1913) street paving bonds for year 1922. Said coupons were inspected by the city council and turned by the City Treasurer in their presence.

J. S. Clive moved that the resignation of L. M. Provin, as chief of the Fire Department of the City of Pikeville be received and accepted, said resignation having heretofore been tendered, and which is in words and figures as follows;
