

at a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 8th day of May, 1923, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, John A. McCowan, J. S. Cline, T. J. Marshall, W. L. Morris and Rush Sword.

J. S. Cline moved that John A. Bentley, chief of Fire Department, be authorized to buy 300 feet of hose and necessary wrenches, valves and connections. Rush Sword seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; Rush Sword, yes; W. L. Morris, yes; T. J. Marshall, yes; John A. McCowan, yes; E. M. Hatfield, absent. Said motion carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that time for receiving bids for sewerage contract in Cline addition be extended until May 15th, 1923.

J. S. Cline moved that certified check for \$100.00 deposited by Campbell Construction Company with city clerk in connection with its bid for paving of Steele Street, alleys, etc. be returned to said company since it has executed bond required by ordinance. John A. McCowan seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Mayor J. L. Morgan filed his report with reference to Caroline Avenue which is in words and figures as follows:

Said motion carried and said ordinance passed and adopted.

R. B. Lawson city assessor, appeared in open council with assessor's book with assessment work done for year 1923. J. S. Cline moved that said book and work be accepted. John A. McCowan seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

It appearing that Mrs. Stella Stanley and H. S. Daupre have failed and refused to act and serve as members of the city board of equalization for the year 1923, John A. McCowan moved that George Pinson, Jr. and W. K. Elliott be appointed in their stead. W. L. Morris seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried John A. McCowan
was elected mayor pro tem.

Upon motion of J. S. Clingan, duly seconded by Rush Sword and
Carried Willie Stiles is granted permit to erect two story
brick residence on Fycamore Street in accordance with and
pursuant to city ordinances.

Upon motion of J. S. Clingan, seconded by T. J. Marshall and carried
Marta Collingsworth is granted permit to erect two story
brick business building on Second Street between Grace and
Caroline Avenues in accordance with and pursuant to city
ordinances.

Upon motion of J. S. Clingan, duly seconded by Rush Sword and
Carried R. T. Johnson is granted permit to erect brick residence
on Fifth Street.

J. S. Clingan moved that the street named Park Street running up
Hollow between G. W. Green and G. D. Clingan and which was
given to the city by T. J. Williamson, be changed in name from
Park Street to Jefferson Street, and that the street be paved
from present paving to the first curve or as far as the city
received it to about 1800 feet. T. J. Marshall seconded said
motion, which carried unanimously.

J. S. Clingan moved that the alley or street connecting Seventh
Street and Eighth Street between the property of Mrs. Dixie
Ratty and John M. Hatch and others be known under
the name of "Cycle Road", and that the city engineer proceed
to locate street paving on said road and locate center
lines and establish grades for street paving. T. J. Marshall
seconded said motion, which carried.

city during April, 1923.

J. S. Clingan moved that Campbell Construction Company be
permitted to cross Grace Avenue with sewer to connect
Williams & Stump Hotel building and J. P. Bailey building
on Main Street by removing base and brick paving and
