J. S. Cline introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance fixing the tax levy for the year 1923 for school and city purposes," said moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted, John A. At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 17th day of July, 1923, the following were present: J.L. Morgan, Mayor and Councilmen, J.S. Cline, Rush Sward and John A. McCowan.

J.S. Cline moved that Millard D. M. Burke be granted permit to erect two story brick building on east side of Second Street between Division Avenue and Grace Avenue. Rush Sward seconded said motion, which carried.

J.S. Cline moved that G.H. Francisco be granted permit to erect garage on Loxier Avenue pursuant to terms of city ordinances, and that he be granted permit to use street to connect with sewer and to use street for purpose of obtaining water on Loxier Avenue pursuant to terms of city ordinances. Rush Sward seconded said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Chero-Cola Bottling Company is granted permit to use four feet of Auxier Avenue for dirt in connection with sewage etc., pursuant to terms of city ordinances.

On motion made, duly seconded and unanimously carried it is ordered that R.D. Knobler, city treasurer, pay to the First National Bank of Pikeville, Kentucky, for Kelley Brothers, the sum of \$250⁰⁰ for the following street paving

bonds on new contract (years 1920-1921), for the year 1922, which said bonds are designated as follows:

Said bonds were inspected by the city council and burned by the city treasurer in their presence.

J.S. Cline moved that A.L. Radcliff, city attorney, be directed to take proper proceedings to collect from the Kentucky & West Virginia Power Company the sum of \$35⁰⁰ for damages to the city's street sweeper which was broken by said company's agents, John A. McCowan seconded said motion, which carried.

Whereas Mel Buckley is now confined in the jail of Pike County under a sentence of sixty days imprisonment and \$100⁰⁰ fine and cost, and required to give a peace bond; and

It further appearing that the said Mel Buckley will have served thirty days on Saturday, July 21st, J.S. Cline, a member of the Pardon Board of the City Council, moved that the said sentence of Mel Buckley be commuted to thirty days from July 21, 1923, provided the said Mel Buckley pays the \$100⁰⁰ fine and cost and executes the peace bond as required by the said judgment. Said motion was carried by the following vote of the Pardon Board: J.S. Cline, yes; John A. McCowan, no; J.L. Morgan, yes. Said motion carried.

John A. McCowan tendered his resignation as a member of the Pardon Board of the City Council, but no action was taken on same.

The following was filed with reference to the above pardon and made a part of the record:

It appearing from the records of the City of Pikeville Council, Pikeville, Kentucky, that J.L. Morgan, J.S. Cline and John A. McCowan have been appointed and selected as Pardon Board for the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, with power to grant pardons for felonies and infractions imposed by the Police Judge and Police Courts of Pikeville, Kentucky;

It is hereby ordered by the Board of Pardons that the sixty day imprisonment of Mel Buckley be made, and is hereby reduced to thirty days, and the jailer of Pike County is hereby directed to release Mel Buckley after he has settled his fine and costs and executed peace bond and served the thirty days of said sixty day sentence.

The reason of the action of this board in this matter is that it is customary for offenders of the prohibition laws who do not deny the charge and do not take the witness stand and swear falsely be given the lowest penalty.
