The following order was made by the Council at its meeting of August 25, 1923, and is entered none pro tunc.

J. S. Cline introduced the following resolution and moved that same be passed and adopted:

"Whereas, it has been made known that the business men of Johnson City, Tennessee, known as the 'Johnson City Boosters' will visit our town on the 29th day of August, 1923, from 12 o'clock noon until 2 o'clock P.M.,

Be it resolved by the City Council of Pikeville, Kentucky, that we heartily welcome said 'Boosters', and call upon all of the citizens living in Pikeville and Pike County to join with us in extending to the 'Boosters' a hearty reception and in every way make their visit to our city pleasant and agreeable.

Done at the Council Chamber in the City of Pikeville on the 25th day of August, 1923."

W. L. Morris seconded Mr. Cline's motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, yes; W. L. Morris, yes; Rush Sward, yes; J. J. Marshall, yes; John A. McCowan, yes; E. M. Hatfield, absent; J. L. Morgan, Mayor, absent.

Said motion carried unanimously and it is ordered that a copy of this resolution be spread at large upon the minute books of the City of Pikeville; that a copy be published in the 'Pike County News'; and that a copy be delivered to the chairman of said Boosters club.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the City Hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 4th day of September, 1923, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, W. L. Morris, Rush Sward and J. S. Cline.

On motion of J. S. Cline, duly seconded and unanimously carried, it is ordered that R. C. Honaker, City Treasurer, pay to the First National Bank of Pikeville, Kentucky, for Kelly Brothers the sum of \$2,500.00 for the following five street paving bonds on new contract for street paving (done years 1920-1921)

- for the year 1922, which said bonds are designated as follows, Street paving bond no. 19, Series Two, for \$500.00, dated January 5, 1921, due August 1, 1922. Street paving bond no. 20, Series Two, for \$500.00, dated January 5, 1921, due August 1, 1922. Street paving bond no. 21, Series Two, for \$500.00, dated January 5, 1921, due August 1, 1922. Street paving bond no. 22, Series Two, for \$500.00, dated January 5, 1921, due August 1, 1922. Street paving bond no. 23, Series Two, for \$500.00, dated January 5, 1921, due August 1, 1922.

The above bonds were delivered to the city treasurer by the First National Bank, and inspected by the Council and burned by the city treasurer in their presence.

J. S. Cline moved that two street lights, one located near the junction of Caroline Avenue and Main Street, and the other near Caroline and Second Street, be moved so as to be near the juncture of the avenue and the streets aforesaid; that a new street light be placed near the center of Caroline Avenue between Main and Second Streets; that one light be located where Riverside Drive turns right angles westward; and that one light be located on Sixth Street near alley, which is near center of street between Scott Avenue and Cline Street. W. L. Morris seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; W. L. Morris, yes; Rush Sward, yes; John A. McCowan, absent; J. J. Marshall, absent; E. M. Hatfield, absent; J. L. Morgan, yes. The Mayor declared said motion carried.

J. S. Cline moved that the Pikeville Supply and Planing Mill Company be exonerated from the payment of taxes on the sum of \$5,000.00 for the year 1922, it appearing that same was due to error, reducing the assessment from \$35,000 to \$30,000. W. L. Morris seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; W. L. Morris, yes; E. M. Hatfield, absent; J. J. Marshall, absent; John A. McCowan, absent; Rush Sward, yes; J. L. Morgan, yes. Said motion carried.

J. S. Cline moved that the paving of the alley from Elm Street to the property line of Mrs. Kate D. Hatfield be passed for further consideration, and that it be therein provided that all of said street to alley be paved from its intersection with Elm Street to its northern terminus, and that resolution be published to that effect, and that the protest of A. S. Rattiff be passed. Rush Sward seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; Rush Sward, yes; W. L.
