At a regular adjourned meeting of the common council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 7th day of November 1923, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen J. S. Cline, T. J. Marshall, John A. McCowan, Rush Sward and W. L. Morris.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Bob Dayton is granted permit to connect with sewer on Kentucky Avenue, but not to tunnel same, and to be done pursuant to terms of city ordinance.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Mrs. J. J. Moore is granted permit to connect with sewer at corner of Caroline Avenue and Second Street, but not to tunnel same, and to be done pursuant to terms of city ordinance.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the City Engineer is directed to make changes on Huffman and Second Street corner at Mrs. J. J. Moore's property line, and at corner of Second Huffman and College Streets pursuant to directions of street committee.

Mr. Holman, agent for J. C. Mayer & Company, of Cincinnati, Ohio, and J. J. Moore, their Attorney, and Mr. Woody, of the firm of Walter Woody & Heimlinger, of Cincinnati, Ohio, addressed the Council upon the question of sale of water and sewer bonds.

J. S. Cline moved that action on the water bond question be deferred for further consideration. John A. McCowan seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; John A. McCowan, aye; T. J. Marshall, aye; W. L. Morris, yes; Rush Sward, yes; E. M. Atfield, absent. Said motion carried.

On motion of J. S. Cline, duly seconded by Rush Sward and unanimously carried, it is ordered that R. O. Honable, City Treasurer pay to the First National Bank of Pikeville, Kentucky, the sum of \$3478.27 for the following street paving (old year 1913) bonds due year 1923:

Said payment was made in open council,
Said bonds were inspected by the city council in open
session and burned by the mayor in their presence, the trea-
surer now being absent.

On motion of J. S. Cline, duly seconded by Rush Seward and
unanimously carried, it is ordered that R. O. Howaker, City
Treasurer, pay to the First National Bank of Pikeville, Ken-
tucky, for Kelly Brothers, the sum of \$485.80 for interest
coupons on (old year 1913) street paving bonds for
year 1923. Said payment was made in open coun-
cil, and said coupons were inspected by the city
council in open session, and burned by the mayor
in their presence, the city treasurer now being absent.

The petition of M. Wiley was produced and read to the Council
in which the said Wiley stated that a few months ago he
became bondman for one Bill Gardner who was charged
in Police Court with a violation of the prohibition laws, in
the sum of \$100.00, that the said Gardner would appear on
the 2nd day of August, 1923, to answer said charge, that the
said Gardner appeared and was tried and fined \$200.00 and
30 days in jail, that the said Gardner was granted an appeal
to the Pike County Court and tendered appeal bond, but the
presiding judge did not have time to take said appeal bond
at the time, and advised the said Gardner to wait until future
date to execute said bond, that after a few days the said
Gardner left the County, and his whereabouts is now
unknown. Petitioner further stated that he was advised by
the Police Judge and Policeman that the said Gardner
would be placed under a new bond the following day and
that he wanted only be on said bond until the trial of which
was the following day. Wherefore, petitioner asked that
the forfeiture be remitted.

J. S. Cline, a member of the City Bonding Board moved
that the above forfeiture be set aside and remitted, John A. McCowan,
another member of said board, seconded said
motion. Upon roll call of the City Bonding Board the
vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, yes; John A. McCowan,
yes; J. L. Morgan, Mayor, yes. Said motion carried.

Upon motion of J. S. Cline duly seconded by John A. McCowan and
carried, it is ordered that W.C. Hamby be exonerated from
the payment of taxes for the year 1923 in the sum of
\$200.00 it appearing that said Hamby was erroneously
assessed with said amount.

Place to east line of Central Avenue, sub divided as follows etc.

J. S. Cline introduced an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Pro-
hibiting excavating, digging or tunneling under the pavement
of any improved street alley or other public property and
fixing a penalty for the violation of same" and moved that
said ordinance be passed and adopted. Rush Seward seconded
said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows:
J. S. Cline, aye; Rush Seward, yes; J. J. Marshall, yes; E. M.
Watfield, absent; W. L. Morris, yes; John A. McCowan, yes.
Said motion carried.

J. S. Cline moved that the gas franchise passed October 16, 1923
and authorized to be sold on the 3rd day of November (does not
say what year) be changed in paragraph "D" in line 4 by
striking out the words or figures "seventy eight cents (.78)"
and insert in lieu thereof "thirty five (.35) cent" so as to
read, beginning with line 4 in paragraph "D", "thirty-five
(.35) cents for one thousand (1000) cubic feet of gas and
said purchaser shall allow a discount of three cents
per thousand cubic feet on bills paid by the consumer
at the office of said purchaser" etc. John A. McCowan seconded
said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows:
J. S. Cline, aye; John A. McCowan, aye; Rush Seward, yes; W. L.
Morris, yes; J. J. Marshall, yes; E. M. Watfield, absent.
Said motion carried.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the
City of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the city hall in the City of
Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 13th day of November 1923, the
following were present: Councilman John A. McCowan, J. S.
Cline, T. J. Marshall and Rush Sward.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council elected
John A. McCowan as Mayor pro tem.

A certified copy of the vote on the water and sewer bonds
was produced and filed, which is as follows:

"State of Kentucky, Y.S.
County of Pike,"

We, J. M. Johnson, Sheriff, and B. A. Rattiff, a member
of the Board of Election Commissioners of Pike County do certify
that at an election held in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky on
Tuesday November 6th, 1923 voters were cast for and against
the following proposals, then submitted as follows:

1. For the incurring of an indebtedness by the issuing
of \$130,000⁰⁰ of bonds due thirty (30) years from their
date and bearing interest at six per centum per annum,
payable semi-annually, for the purpose of providing the
City of Pikeville with suitable water works and the
necessary appurtenances thereto. The amount of money
necessary to be raised by taxation to pay the interest on
said bonds and to provide a sinking fund to pay said
bonds when due, is \$12,134⁰⁰.

2. For the incurring of an indebtedness by the issuing
of \$11,000⁰⁰ of bonds due thirty (30) years from their
date and bearing interest at six per centum per annum,
payable semi-annually, for the purpose of providing the
City of Pikeville with suitable sewers and appurte-
nances necessary thereto. The amount of money necessary

to be raised annually by taxation to pay the interest
on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund to
pay said bonds, when due, \$1,027⁰⁰.

said motion carried.

J. S. Cline moved that the city clerk and chief of police
and all city officers make settlements within the next
ten days. Rush Sward seconded said motion, which
carried unanimously.

\$50⁰⁰ for salary as city treasurer for months of August,
September, October and November, 1923.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried council is
adjourned until tomorrow night November 14th, 1923, for the
purpose of passing and acting on street paving legis-
lation in Cline addition, and adjourned until Monday
November 19th, 1923 for regular business, being regular
adjourned meeting.
