At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City
of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the city hall in the City of
Pikeville, Kentucky on the 4th day of December, 1923, the fol-
lowing were present: Councilmen Jerry Robinson, H. J. Day,

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried R. J. Day was
elected mayor pro tem.

Council was addressed by H. J. Day Mayor Pro tem after
which, upon motion of Dr. Z. A. Thompson, Council was
opened by prayer, by Rev. E. Layton Howerton, Pastor of
the Baptist Church, City.

Dr. Z. A. Thompson moved that H. J. Day and Jerry Robinson
be appointed as street committee. Dr. A. J. Ratliff seconded
said motion, which carried.

Dr. Z. A. Thompson moved that any claims which are filed
for payment by the Council that the parties who file
said claims are to be present and verify said claims
in open Council before payment. Jerry Robinson seconded
said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered
that J. M. Mullins be granted permit to erect ten room frame
building on High Street immediately back of property of
J. M. Riddle, pursuant to terms of city ordinances.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered
that K. D. Keece be granted permit to erect four room frame
building on High Street immediately back of property of
J. M. Riddle, pursuant to terms of city ordinances.

report to the Council at the next regular meeting. Jerry Rob-
inson seconded said motion, which carried.

Dr. Z. A. Thompson moved that the secretary (city clerk) be di-
rected to write R. O. Honaker, City Treasurer, to either come to
Pikeville and sign street paving bonds or about the
first of the year of resign. Jerry Robinson seconded said
motion, which carried.

Came Kentucky Wholesale Grocery Company, by H. J. Day,
its manager, and H. J. Day, individually in open Council and
withdraw any and all objections to the paving of north
Hillier Street and closing of Pike Avenue crossing, which
crosses over the Chesapeake and Ohio railroad and inter-
sects with said street.

Z. A. Thompson moved that the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad
Company be notified of the fact of the withdrawal of objec-
tions by Mr. Day and the Kentucky Wholesale Grocery
Company, and the City Clerk is directed to notify Mr. Harris,
the railroad company's superintendent. Jerry Robinson
seconded said motion, which carried.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 18th day of December, 1923, the following were present; Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, T. A. Thompson, A. J. Ratliff, K. J. Day, and L. H. Duty.

The minutes of the meetings of December 3, 1923, and December 4th, 1923, were read and approved.

On this, the 18th day of December, 1923, appeared, James Matney, Chief of Police of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and executed bond with National Surety Company as surety in the penal sum of \$2500⁰⁰. The said bond was approved by the Council, being given for the year 1924, and is in words and figures as follows:

We, James Matney, principal, and National Surety Company, surety, covenant to and with the Commonwealth of Kentucky, for the benefit of whom it may concern in the sum of Twenty Five Hundred (\$2500⁰⁰) Dollars that said Matney will faithfully discharge all the duties of the Office of Chief of Police of the City of Pikeville, and pay over all sums of money that come into his hands to the person entitled thereto and for any unlawful arrest or unnecessary cruel treating or assaulting in making an arrest.
