At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 1st day of January, 1924, the following were present: Mayor, J. H. Sauley, and Councilmen, K. J. Day, Z. A. Thompson, Jerry Robinson, L. A. Duty and A. T. Rattiff.

The minutes of the meetings of December 18, December 24 and December 29, 1923, were read and approved.

Z. A. Thompson moved that the six city councilmen and mayor donate their services as such officials to the city for the year 1924. Jerry Robinson seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Mr. Seaton Preston, manager of Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company, appeared in open Council and stated that his company wanted a new light franchise, and as part consideration therefor

his company would reduce the prices charged the city for street lights etc.

Z. A. Thompson moved that a committee of three be appointed to look into the light franchise matter and report at the next regular meeting, and suggested K. J. Day, A. T. Rattiff and Jerry Robinson as members of said committee. Jerry Robinson seconded said motion, which carried.

The Mayor, therefore, appointed K. J. Day, A. T. Rattiff and Jerry Robinson as said committee.

Jerry Robinson moved that a committee of two, to wit, K. J. Day and Z. A. Thompson, be appointed to call upon and consult with James Matney, Chief of Police, with reference to appointment of policeman's salaries to the chief of police and board of Council, and report to the Council tomorrow night January 2nd, 1924. A. T. Rattiff seconded said motion, which carried.

Z. A. Thompson moved that all policemen be required to purchase and carry a mace or billy. K. J. Day seconded said motion, which carried.

K. J. Day moved that A. T. Rattiff and Jerry Robinson be appointed as Gardening Board for the City of Pikeville. Z. A. Thompson seconded said motion, which carried.

A petition signed by certain citizens was presented to the Council and filed asking that alley between College Street and Railroad right of way, and running parallel thereto, be paved. Certain citizens appeared in Council and objected thereto.

Z. A. Thompson moved that the matter of the paving of alley between College Street and railroad, and running parallel thereto, be referred to the street committee, and that it investigate said matter and report at the next regular meeting of the Council.

R. L. Sparks appeared before the Council and asked that the city install sewerage sufficient to connect with his house on North Keller Street. Z. A. Thompson moved that said matter be referred to the street committee. Jerry Robinson seconded said motion, which carried.

Mrs. Stella Starkey, owner and manager of Eastern Kentucky Home Telephone Company, appeared in open Council and asked that the Council sell a new telephone franchise, increasing telephone rates etc., and gave her reasons therefor.

upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that the Mayor and Council as a whole take Mrs. Starkey's figure and investigate matter of sale of new franchise and report as soon as possible.

Ordered that Frank L. Haynes be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$51.50 for engineering services and expenses relative to paving work during month of December, 1923.
