

at a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 11th day of February, 1924 the following were present: Mayor, J. upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that J. L. Clarke be and he is hereby granted permit to erect ten room frame building on Julius Avenue (fifth lot on left from foot of said avenue), pursuant to terms of city ordinance.

Ordered that Jake Russell be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$16.10 for opening sewer on Kentucky Avenue, February 8-9, 1924, 2-3 hours @ 70¢.

Ordered that John Mc Guire be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$16.10 for opening sewer on Kentucky Avenue, February 8-9, 1924, 2-3 hours @ 70¢.

Ordered that Foster Hornburg Hardware Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$49.95 for one joint 2 1/4 inch sewer pipe by order of J. M. Robinson as per bill of February 5, 1924.

Ordered that Earl Scott be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$13.13 for freight on sump parts, \$6.24, paid J. M. Perry for repairing sump \$3.00, telegrams with reference to sump parts \$3.35, during January and February, 1924.

upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that the matter of payment of \$200.00 to Earl Scott, street cleaner, being salary for month of January, 1924, be passed over until next regular meeting.

This day came J. F. Pauley, Mayor, R. D. Honaker, City Treasurer, by O. O. Graham Assistant Treasurer, and J. M. Hatcher, City Clerk, and produced and had filed report as to advertisement of street improvement bonds designated as "Series D", which said report is in words and figures as follows:

"To the Mayor and members of the City Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky: Your undersigned Committee would respectfully report that it duly advertised for sale that certain series of street improvement bonds designated as 'Series D' date of November 20th 1923, ten days prior to the date designated for the sale of said bonds, that it did not receive any bids for said bonds equal to par with accrued interest or any other amount, said bonds advertised as above stated being 37 for \$500.00 each, and one for \$358.81, totaling \$18,858.81."

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Board of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, that after due advertisement for bids and sale of that certain series of street improvement bonds designated as "Series D", date of November 20th, 1923, 37 bonds for \$500.00 each and one for \$358.81 totaling \$18,858.81, the committee failed to receive any bids or offers for said bonds equal to par and accrued interest or otherwise; it is therefore ordered that said bonds in the number and amounts as above described be, and they are hereby turned over to the Campbell Construction Company, contractors for said street improvement in full payment of said improvement for which said bonds were issued; said Campbell Construction Company being present in open Council and accepts said bonds in full payment for the contract price of said improvement for which they were issued.

at a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 19th day of February, 1924 the following were present: Mayor, J. F. Pauley, and Councilmen, L. A. Duty, Z. A. Thompson and A. J. Rattiff.

The minutes of the meetings of February 5th and February 11th, 1924, were read and approved.

upon motion of Z. A. Thompson duly seconded by L. A. Duty and carried, it is ordered that the matter of extension of Main Street be deferred until next Tuesday, February 26th, 1924.

Mr. Gibbs of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company appeared in open Council and stated that there was a great deal of hoisting around the new passenger depot and defacing of its property and asked that the city officials cooperate with it in the protection of said property, and pass necessary ordinances for said purpose.

A. J. Rattiff moved that the city attorney prepare and present proper ordinances for protection of new C. & O. passenger depot at Council's next meeting. Z. A. Thompson seconded said motion, which carried.

Ordered that J.N. Huffman Coal Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$33.00 for coal account for city hall in full to date as per bill of February 15, 1924.

Upon motion of Z.A. Thompson, duly seconded by A.T. Rattiff and carried, H.C. Dick Scott is granted permit to erect and maintain wooden sidewalk along property of J.M. Johnson & Co (formerly owned by John Bowles estate) on Division Street temporarily, to be removed when so ordered by Council.

Mrs. Stella Starkey asked the Council for an expression of its views with reference to increasing rates of Eastern Kentucky Home Telephone Company.

It appearing that matter of increase of telephone rates has been referred to W.W. Barnett and he is now absent said matter is deferred until next regular meeting of the Council.

Auditor A.D. Roberts, heretofore employed to audit city books, records &c., presented and had filed four copies of his audit, for the period December 1, 1921, to November 30, 1923 inclusive, and read same to the Council in open Council.

A.T. Rattiff moved that the audit of A.D. Roberts representing the National Audit Company, be accepted and filed. Z.A. Thompson seconded said motion, which carried.

It appearing from the audit that city vouchers or warrants to the amount of \$6223.21 are missing from the city treasurer's records and not on file, upon motion of Z.A. Thompson, duly seconded by L.A. Duty and carried, the city clerk is directed to write R.O. Honaker, City Treasurer, for said vouchers and ask that same be accounted for, so that he may have credit therefor.

For the information and benefit of the Council, A.D. Roberts Auditor, presented and had filed in behalf of Eastern Kentucky Home Telephone Company with reference to proposed increase in telephone rates &c., two typewritten sheets, one entitled "Comparative Statement of Profit and Loss", and other entitled "Depreciation Schedule".

It appearing from the Auditor's report that Warrant no. 1064, payable to J.M. Hatcher for \$57.50 for salary and services as city clerk for month of August, 1923 dated September 4, 1923 was neither signed nor endorsed upon request of J.M. Hatcher city clerk. A.T. Rattiff moved that same be now signed and endorsed, Z.A. Thompson seconded said motion which carried, and said voucher no. 1064 is now signed by the city clerk and mayor, and endorsed by J.M. Hatcher.

T.A. Connelly, representing Mountain Water Company, appeared in open Council and stated that the contractors for the improvement of streets &c were leaving water pipes exposed in different parts of the city, and that same were liable to freeze and burst and that the people needed protection in this matter.

Z.A. Thompson moved that said matter be referred to the street committee and that it report Tuesday night February 26, 1924. A.T. Rattiff seconded said motion, which carried.
