

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1924, the following were present: Mayor J. F. Pauley, and Councilmen A. T. Rattiff, L. A. Duty, Jerry Robinson and T. A. Thompson.

Upon motion of T. A. Thompson, duly seconded by A. T. Rattiff and carried, it is ordered that the Street Committee together with A. L. Rattiff, city attorney, take up with Foster Thornburg Hardware Company the matter of extending alley through their property connecting with Jefferson Street and running between and parallel with College Street and C. & O. railroad.

Ordered that J. E. Sanders be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$450 for preparing pleading for city attorney in Francis Hollow case against city during January, 1924.

If appearing that vouchers no. 1073, payable to Amick J. Haynes for \$193<sup>25</sup>, dated October 2, 1923; no. 1082, payable to Mrs. Lida Hellier Moore for \$3500 dated August 7, 1923, and voucher no. 1083, payable to Mrs. Lida Hellier Moore for \$8000, dated August 7, 1923, have been lost or otherwise misplaced, and duplicates have been issued therefore, upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, it is now ordered that the above named and numbered vouchers be and they are hereby canceled, and the city clerk is directed to certify copy of this order to the city treasurer.

If appearing that voucher no. 1024 is outstanding or missing from the Voucher or Warrant book, without being identified by any stub in the voucher book or order of city Council upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that the above named and numbered voucher be, and same is hereby canceled, and the city clerk will certify copy of this order to the city treasurer.

A. T. Rattiff introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance prohibiting loaping in and about railway depots, churches, schools, court house or other public buildings, and prohibiting defacing and injuring buildings or other public property in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and providing penalty therefor," and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. Jerry Robinson seconded said motion upon roll call the vote was as follows: A. T. Rattiff, yes; Jerry Robinson, yes; R. J. Day, absent; T. A. Thompson, yes; L. A. Duty, yes; W. W. Barrett, absent. Said motion carried and said ordinance passed.

Upon motion of A. T. Rattiff, duly seconded by L. A. Duty and carried the matter of extension of Main street is referred to the Street Committee to report at the next regular meeting of the Council.

Ordered that

Earl Scott be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$200<sup>00</sup> for salary as street cleaner for month of January, 1924.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council is adjourned until its next regular meeting.

F. Pauley and Councilmen Jerry Robinson, L. A. Duty, R. J. Day, A. T. Rattiff and T. A. Thompson.

The minutes of the meetings of February 19, 1924, and February 26, 1924, were read and approved.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, it is ordered that Pauley, Rogers & Pauley be granted permit to erect four story brick building on northwest corner of Main and Caroline streets, pursuant to terms of city ordinances.

Bitter Bales presented and had filed claim for services and salary as policeman for months of January and February, 1924, totaling \$2500. Jerry Robinson moved that said claim be disallowed, T. A. Thompson seconded said motion, which carried.

Ordered that

T. H. Huffman Coal Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$350 for one load of coal for police station as per bill of March 1, 1924, which is in full to date.

Ordered that

Frank L. Haynes be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$2250 for engineering work and expenses relative to new street and alley construction in second zone during February, 1924.

Ordered that

Carl Scott be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$500 for repairing sprocket wheel to street sweeper by T. M. Berry and paid by Carl Scott as per bill of March 1, 1924.

Upon motion of T. A. Thompson, duly seconded by Jerry Robinson and carried, the clerk is directed to write the firm of Walter, Woody & Zimmerman, bond dealers, of Cincinnati, Ohio, in answer to their letter of February 7, 1924, that this Council does not consider that it endorses the said firm anything by reason of water and sewer bonds legislation alleged to have been prepared by said firm.
