O.O. Graham appeared in open Council, accepted the office of city treasurer of the City of Pikeville; took the oath of office as required by law, and entered upon his duties as such treasurer.

K.J. Day introduced an ordinance which is an ordinance providing for the issuance of street improvement bonds to the amount of \$18,858.81, fixing the denominations thereof, for the payment of certain street improvement in Zone No. 6, Cline addition,

and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. T.G. Parker seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: K.J. Day, yes; T.G. Parker, yes; Jerry Robinson, yes; L.A. Duty, yes; R. Thompson, yes; A.J. Ratliff, yes. Said motion carried.

A.D. Roberts, representing Eastern Kentucky Home Telephone Company, appeared before the Council and asked that a committee be appointed to take up with said telephone company the question of rates.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the Council as a whole is appointed to take up with Eastern Kentucky Home Telephone Company question of rates.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the question of paving of Jefferson street is referred to the Street Committee.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried T.G. Parker, A.J. Ratliff, Jerry Robinson and the City Clerk are appointed as a committee to buy necessary files for city clerks office.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried Council is adjourned until next regular meeting.
