upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, H. Wells is granted permit to erect two light posts on side walk in front of his property on Division Street, pursuant to terms of city ordinances.

Lynn D. Sanders be and they are hereby allowed the sum of \$14.00 for writing answer and copies of bills of exceptions and record in case of J. B. Honaker vs. City of Pikeville.

Butler Bales presented and had filed claim for services as deputy chief of police for months of January, February and March 1924, totaling \$37.50. Jerry Robinson moved that said claim be disallowed, R. Thompson seconded said motion, which carried.

G. J. Ratliff moved that Coleman Fruit Company be granted permit to erect 500 gallon gasoline tank in front of their place of business on College Street, pursuant to terms of city ordinances. Jerry Robinson seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

George Pinson, Jr. be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$130.00 as follows: for serving on board of supervisors for year 1923 \$30.00; serving as street paving inspector 25 days @ \$4.00, during July and August, 1923, in line addition.

Frank S. Haynes be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$196.50 for engineering services and expenses on new work in second zone relating to streets between Sixth Street and Main Street, and north Heller Street during March, 1924.

Came the American Telephone & Telegraph Company of Kentucky, Incorporated, and presented and moved the Board of Council to order a sale of franchise to construct, operate and maintain telegraph and telephone lines and all appliances and appurtenances thereunto appertaining upon, over, along, under and across the streets and alleys of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the period of twenty years from and after the granting of said franchise.

K. J. Day moved that such franchise be sold, Jerry Robinson seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: K. J. Day, yes; Jerry Robinson, yes; L. A. Duty, yes; R. Thompson, yes; J. G. Parker, yes; G. J. Ratliff, yes.

It is therefore ordered by the board of Council that J. M. Hatcher be and he is hereby appointed as special Commissioner of this Council to sell and is hereby ordered to offer for sale franchise as above set forth, which he will offer for sale at the front door of the Court house in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, after having advertised the time, place and terms of sale for at least ten days next before the day of sale, to the highest and best bidder for cash in hand. He will advertise the same by written notices put up one at the Court house door in the City of Pikeville and at three public places in the vicinity thereof. The Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on April 3rd, 1924, the following were present: Mayor, Z. A. Thompson, and Councilmen, J. G. Barker, A. J. Rattiff, L. A. Duty and K. J. Day.

The firm of "The J. N. Chester Engineers" of Pittsburg, Pa., made the following offer of proposition to the City Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, with reference to water works system &c:

"Pittsburgh, Pa., March 18, 1924.

Honorable City Council, Pikeville, Ky.

Gentlemen: After an examination of conditions surrounding the proposed development of a new water supply and purification system for your city, we respectfully submit for your consideration our terms for performing all of the engineering services connected with the design and supervision of the improvements and the appraisal and negotiations for the purchase of the existing private plant, as follows:

- Item 1. For investigation and report on a complete water works system, ----- \$750.00
- Item 2. Investigation, appraisal and Report on present water works system and assistance in negotiations ----- \$500.00
- Item 3. For surveys, Plans and Specifications of Improvements and assistance in letting of contracts, ----- 3.25% of gross cost.
- Item 4. For services of Resident Engineer during construction ----- \$2500.00 per month
- Item 5. For supervision by Pittsburgh office during construction ----- 1.50% of gross cost.

Payments to be made as follows: Item 1, 30 days after presentation of report, Item 2, 30 days after completion of negotiations, or in case of failure of amicable agreement between City and water company, payment to be due 30 days thereafter, Item 3 30 days after letting of contracts or 60 days after presentation of plans and specifications should City defer letting contracts for this period of time, Item 5, on basis of monthly estimates.

Cost of land, rights-of-way and engineering are not to be included in computation of gross cost.

Outline of service to be rendered.

Item 1. The report on the water works improvements will include sketches and costs of construction and annual fixed charges and operating expenses for all and any of the different projects we may investigate. Various projects will be developed and offered you for consideration, including alternate locations of pumping station, purification plant, reservoir and boosted service that you may have definite information as to the merits of the different locations & schemes and thus be better able to make the best choice.
