At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the City Hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky on the 20th day of January, 1925, the following were present: Mayor, J. D. Thompson, and Councilmen, L. G. Duty, R. Thompson, A. T. Ratliff and K. J. Day.

Upon motion of A. T. Ratliff, duly seconded by K. J. Day and carried, the following are granted permit to sell licenses for the following things; up to July 1st, 1925:

Sam Saad appeared before the Council and made complaint as to sewer and water disturbance at his property on High Street, which matter was referred to the Water Committee.

Councilman, R. S. Johnson, is now present.

K. J. Day moved that the Mayor write the Attorney General of the State of Kentucky with reference to taxes of Mountain Water Company, Sandy Valley Light & Power Company and Pikeville Ice Company. A. T. Ratliff seconded said motion, which carried.

Mrs. C. T. Hinton presented an ordinance entitled "An ordinance regulating the keeping or storage of naptha, gasoline or other highly inflammable liquids by wholesale dealers" and asked that same be passed, discussing its merits at length. K. J. Day moved that same be laid over to next meeting of Council. R. S. Johnson seconded said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, the Mayor is requested to write The Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company for permit to lay water pipes under certain parts of its right of way in the City of Pikeville.

A. T. Ratliff moved that The Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company be exonerated from payment of penalties on its 1924 franchise and tangible taxes for reason that it had not been filed for more than thirty days before date of penalty. K. J. Day seconded said motion, which carried.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried, D. O. Graham is allowed the sum of \$25.55 for telegrams sent in connection with water works system and paid for by said Graham, payable out of the Pikeville Water Works Fund.

Upon motion of A. T. Ratliff, duly seconded by R. Thompson and carried, the following estimate of amounts were allowed the various water works contractors and the city treasurer is directed to pay same payable out of the Pikeville Water Works Fund, for December, 1924:

A. Thompson, and Councilmen, H. J. Day, R. S. Johnson, R. Thompson, and A. T. Ratliff.

The following firms had presented bids for \$12,000⁰⁰ water works bonds heretofore voted and ordered sold: Seasongood & Mayer, Cincinnati, Ohio; Walter Woody & Heimerdinger " "

J. C. Mayes & Company " "
and the Council upon Consideration entered the following order:

The Board of Council having heretofore passed a resolution, of date 29th day of July, 1924, authorizing the sale of \$136,000⁰⁰ water works bonds of the City of Pikeville to Walter, Woody & Heimerdinger of Cincinnati, Ohio; and

Whereas, only \$118,000⁰⁰ of said bonds having been sold pursuant to said resolution, and Whereas Council has received bids from various bonding companies for the purchase of the remaining \$13,000⁰⁰; and

It appearing that the said Walter, Woody & Heimerdinger, of Cincinnati, Ohio, is the highest bidder,
Upon motion of A. T. Ratliff, duly seconded by K. J. Day and carried.

It is now ordered that the said remaining \$12,000⁰⁰ of said bonds be, and they are hereby sold to said Walter, Woody & Heimerdinger at the price of \$105.00 per \$100⁰⁰ and accrued interest said bonds bearing 1st day of July, 1924, and being for the period of thirty years, at 5 1/2% interest, interest payable semi-annually.

A. T. Ratliff moved that property owners having buildings or other obstructions on Eighth Street and Scott Road (alley) running parallel with and between Scott Avenue and Cline Street, be notified, and they are hereby directed to remove said buildings or other obstructions from said streets on or before the first day of April, 1925. R. Thompson seconded said motion, which carried.

Bentley, Pikeville Baking Company, Big Four Motor Company, Cline Estate (Heirs of Martha Cline dec.), J. J. Williamson, Millard Burke, J. S. Cline and O. A. Stump be, and they are each hereby directed to close alleys or driveways through their property for improve same so as to keep mud from getting on the streets. Dr. R. S. Johnson seconded said motion, which carried.

A. T. Ratliff moved that A. L. Ratliff, city attorney, be allowed the sum of \$180.00 for office rent for year 1924 and \$20.00 per month for office rent for year 1925. Said motion died for want of a second.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 10th day of February, 1925, the following were present: Mayor, J. A. Thompson, and councilmen A. T. Ratliff, L. A. Duty, R. Thompson, K. J. Day, R. S. Johnson and T. G. Parker.

K. J. Day moved that W. J. Phillips be exonerated from the payment of taxes on the sum of \$200⁰⁰ for the year 1922.
 A. T. Ratliff seconded said motion, which carried.

K. J. Day moved that the Cumberland Garage appear before the Council at its regular meeting of March 3rd to show cause why its garage should not be listed for taxation for year 1924. A. T. Ratliff seconded said motion, which carried.

A. T. Ratliff moved that matter of increasing telephone rates be passed over until next meeting. R. Thompson seconded said motion, which carried.

James Matney, chief of Police, recommended the appointment of W. P. Dawson as special policeman for the period of one week, beginning February 11th, 1925, which appointment was confirmed and approved by Mayor, J. A. Thompson, W. P. Dawson appeared before the city clerk on February 11th, 1925 and took the oath of office as special policeman as required by law.

Mr. D. J. Kinton appeared before Council and called up the passage of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance regulating the keeping or storage of naptha, gasoline or other highly inflammable liquids by wholesale dealers," upon motion made, duly seconded and carried said matter was passed to the next regular meeting.

The mayor appointed A. T. Ratliff, K. J. Day and T. G. Parker as committee to notify the citizens of Pikeville that they may get connection with the water works system by having same made at their (citizens') expense.

Councilmen, K. J. Day and R. Thompson, are now absent.

A. T. Ratliff moved that A. L. Ratliff be allowed the sum of \$180⁰⁰ for office rent as city attorney for the year 1925; and allowed the sum of \$20⁰⁰ per month as office rent and incidental as city attorney for year 1925, in addition to his regular salary of \$500⁰⁰ per month. O. O. Graham be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$12⁵⁰ for salary as city treasurer for month of January, 1925.

Ordered that

James Matney be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$135⁰⁰ for salary as chief of police for month of January, 1925.

Ordered that

J. P. Marrs be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$600⁰⁰ for salary as police judge for month of January, 1925.

Ordered that

J. M. Fletcher be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$76⁸⁰ for salary and services as city clerk for month of January, 1925.
