

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 30th day of June, 1925, the following were present: Mayor A. J. Ratliff and Councilman K. J. Day, Stony Anrich, T. G. Parker and H. E. Syck.

Stony Anrich moved that the hour of Council meetings in the future shall be 7:00 o'clock P.M. H. E. Syck seconded said motion, which carried.

H. E. Syck tendered his resignation as a member of the Board of Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, which is in words and figures as follows:

"Pikeville, Ky., June 30, 1925.

To the Hon. Mayor and City Councilmen:

During existing conditions I am very sorry to have to tender my resignation as city councilman, to take effect immediately.

Stony Anrich moved that said resignation be accepted. K. J. Day seconded said motion, which carried.

Ordered that

Frank & John Scott be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$44<sup>10</sup> for labor of men and teams hauling refuse from city streets March 13-16, 1925.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that J. J. Stone be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$114<sup>25</sup> for expenses in connection with water works system from May 15th to June 30, 1925, payable out of the water works fund.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that Farrell Johnson be, and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$26<sup>66</sup> as pump operator at pumping station, for the last eight days of June, 1925, payable out of the water works fund.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that J. J. Stone be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$200<sup>00</sup> as salary as superintendent of water works system for month of June, 1925, payable out of the water works fund.

J. J. Stone water superintendent presented and had filed letter addressed to the mayor and council recommending that certain things be purchased for the water works system.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried the following amount was allowed to the following water works contractor, and the city treasurer is directed to pay same payable out of the Pikeville Water Works fund, for month of May, 1925.

Upon motion of K. J. Day, duly seconded by Stony Anrich and carried the City of Pikeville by A. J. Ratliff, the mayor, attested by J. M. Hatchel its clerk, signed application of Kentucky and West Virginia Power Company for light for domestic use for city's water pumping station.

J. M. Hatchel be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$127<sup>80</sup> for getting out notices of tax rates for year 1925, and owing with board, 426 notices @ 30¢.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that Kentucky Wholesale Company, Pikeville, Kentucky, be and it is hereby allowed the following for material ordered for city water works system:
