

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall of the city of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 21st day of July, 1925, the following were present: Mayor G. T. Riddle, councilman, L. A. Duty, R. S. Johnson and Stoney Amick.

Stoney Amick moved that the superintendent of the Water Works system be ordered to lay six inch water main on Julius Avenue for about 800 ft. L. A. Duty seconded said motion which carried.

The City Clerk is directed to write J. B. Harris, superintendent of the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company, a letter requesting that crossing near Colomore Thrift Company's wholesale house on Elm Street be repaired.

The City Engineer filed maps entitled "Special Arrangement for catch basins on hillside, curb and gutters" for Julius Avenue and which shows plan for special hillside inlet for Julius Avenue. Stoney Amick moved that said map be adopted and said plan approved. R. S. Johnson seconded said motion, which carried.

Stoney Amick introduced an ordinance entitled "An ordinance for the establishment, conduct and maintenance of public playgrounds and recreation grounds and centers in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky" and moved that said ordinance be passed and adopted. L. A. Duty seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: Stoney Amick, yes; L. A. Duty, yes; R. S. Johnson, yes; K. J. Day, absent; J. G. Riddle, absent, said motion carried and said ordinance was duly passed and adopted.

The Mayor appointed as members of the Play ground and Recreation Board the following for the following number of years as set out by ordinance this day passed:

Stoney Amick nominated J. S. Cline as councilman and moved that he be appointed and elected to fill the unexpired term of H. E. Syck, resigned. R. S. Johnson seconded said motion, which carried.

J. S. Cline being present in open council accepted said office and took the oath of office as councilman of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, as required by law.

Stoney Amick moved that the city engineer be directed to assign numbers to each house and lot in the City of Pikeville. R. S. Johnson seconded said motion, which carried.

Ordered that

Dick Fidler be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$2.00 per evening for day as special policeman July 4th, 1925.

Ordered that

Eastern Kentucky Home Telephone Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$430.95 for telephone service in full to October 1, 1925, and tolle to July 1st, 1925.

J. S. Cline moved that no telephone calls be charged to the City of Pikeville unless authorized by the Mayor. R. S. Johnson seconded said motion, which carried.

Ordered that

Pikeville Supply & Painting Mill Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$113.10 for stakes, hubs, cement &c in connection with street paving, and being in full from April 4th, 1925, to date.

Ordered that

Campbell Construction Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$2,906.60 for construction of storm sewerage on Stratton Street during year 1924, \$282.00, and for north Hellie Street sewer intersection, \$8.60.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that Earl & John Scott be and they are hereby allowed the sum of \$2,392.40 for handling pipe &c and paying freight bill on pipe &c for city water works system from June 26, 1925, to July 21st, 1925, payable out of Pikeville Water Works fund.

F. Battiff and Councilmen A. F. Battiff, Stoney Amick, R. J. Day, L. A. Duty, J. S. Cline and T. G. Parker.

E. M. Thomberry, policeman for City of Pittsville, tendered and had filed his resignation as such, which was read to the Council, and which is in words and figures as follows:

"Aug. 4, 1925.
To the Hon. Mayor and City Council:
Pittsville, Pike County, Ky.:
Gentlemen:

I hereby tender my resignation as policeman for the City of Pittsville, Pike County, Ky., said resignation to take effect immediately,
E. M. Thomberry."

R. J. Day moved that the resignation of E. M. Thomberry as policeman be accepted, T. G. Parker seconded said motion, which carried.

R. J. Day moved that the election of new police man be passed off until next meeting, J. S. Cline moved that said motion be amended so as to select an applicant to fill the unexpired term of said Thomberry, L. A. Duty seconded said motion of J. S. Cline, and upon vote same carried.

J. S. Cline moved that W. V. Young be selected as policeman at the present salary to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of E. M. Thomberry, L. A. Duty seconded said motion, which carried.

J. S. Cline moved that the bond of W. V. Young be fixed at the sum of \$1000.00, Stoney Amick seconded said motion, which carried.

A voucher or warrant for the water works department was submitted to the Council for its approval, after same was read J. S. Cline moved that said voucher be adopted and printed, Stoney Amick seconded said motion, which carried.

Ordered that

W. Kemp Walker be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$165.00 for engineering services for June and July, 1925, in connection with water works plant fixture location, and numbering of houses for postal service.

Upon motion made, duly seconded and carried it is ordered that Campbell Construction Company be allowed it is hereby allowed the sum of \$138 40 for erection of supply house and furnishing material, labor &c for same, payable out of water works fund, same being erected for water works department.

J. S. Cline introduced an ordinance entitled "Jefferson Street Having ordinance" over more of that same he finally passed and adopted. T. G. Parker seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. S. Cline, aye; T. G. Parker, aye; R. J. Day, yes; L. A. Duty, absent; Stoney Amick, yes; P. S. Johnson, absent. The mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance finally passed and adopted.
