At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pittsville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pittsville, Kentucky, on the 4th day of August, 1925, the following were present: Mayor, A. F. Battiff and Councilmen A. F. Battiff, Stoney Amick, R. J. Day, L. A. Duty, J. S. Cline and T. G. Parker.

E. M. Thomberry, policeman for City of Pittsville, tendered and had filed his resignation as such, which was read to the Council, and which is in words and figures as follows:

of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the City Hall  
in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 5th day of  
August, 1925 at 4:30 o'clock P.M., the following were  
present: Mayor A. T. Hartiff, and Councilmen, H. J. Day,  
J. S. Cline and T. G. Parker.

W. V. Young, heretofore having been appointed as policeman  
of the City of Pikeville on August 4, 1925, now appeared  
in open Council and took the oath of office as police-  
man of the City of Pikeville as required by law.

W. V. Young presented bond in the sum of \$1000.00 with  
D. J. Kee, A. R. Venters, G. H. Hughes and W. W. Reynolds  
as sureties. Said W. V. Young, principal, and D. J. Kee,

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1925, the following were present; Mayor, J. G. Fletcher, and councilmen, R. S. Johnson, J. S. Cline and J. G. Parker, and L. A. Duty.

J. S. Cline moved that the Council set the taxes against the different banks of Pikeville as is set out in the Revenue Bill for the years 1923 and 1924. J. G. Parker seconded said motion, which carried.

Therefore, It appearing that there is now pending in the Courts litigation for the purpose of determining whether shares of stock in banks were taxable, for city and graded school purposes, for the year 1923 and that because of said litigation, the First National Bank of Pikeville, Kentucky, The Pikeville National Bank and the Day & Night National Bank of Pikeville, Kentucky, have not paid taxes on their shares of stock valued for said year, at respectively, \$120,000.00, \$80,000.00 and \$43,500.00, and it further appearing that it is to the best interest of the City and of the Pikeville Grades School District that said litigation be stopped and the Controversy relating to said taxes be adjusted on motion of J. S. Cline, seconded by J. G. Parker it is ordered by the following vote,
