At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky held in the City Hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 17th day of November 1925, the following were present: Mayor A. J. Raliff and Councilmen, Stoney Amick, S. H. Fields, L. G. Duty and A. J. Akers.

S. H. Fields moved that contract be entered into with American LaFrance Fire Engine Company, Inc., of Atlanta, Georgia for the purchase of a fire truck at price of \$4300.00 + \$400.00 payable upon receipt of truck and delivery of city's old fire truck to it at valuation of \$1100.00 and remaining \$3200.00 payable as follows: \$700.00 due and payable one year from date \$700.00 two years from date, \$700.00 three years from date and \$700.00 four years from date, and that contract be further entered into with said company for 1250 feet of Oregon fire hose at price of \$1855.00 payable in one and two years, and that the mayor and city clerk be directed to sign said contract in behalf of City of Pikeville, Stoney Amick seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: S.
