Letter from the John H. McGowan Company, Cincinnati, Ohio, with reference to pumps of water works plant was produced, which is as follows:

In order to clear up entirely the pump situation at your city plant, we submit for your consideration the following changes, as talked over with your Mr. Stone, they enabling you to secure the capacity you called for under your specifications covering the improvement and as made under the J. N. Chester Engineers, of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania.

We will furnish a new 2^{1/2} three stage Gould Pump rated at 500 gallons of water per minute against a total head of 300 feet operating at 1750 R.P.M.; supply necessary fittings, labor and material to install it in place of the Harris Pump. The foundation of the Harris Pump is to be altered by us to conform to requirements of your new pump. We to use your 75 H.P. motor, which we will mount on our cast iron base plate and direct connect it to the pump so it will in all appearances be the same as the McGowan three stage pump now in service. The discharge line to have a new fitting installed (in place of the water tee that is in it at present), so as to give a more direct flow to the water.

We will also allow the express charge on Gould Pump, a credit for under capacity on McGowan pump is considered in price below.

My material unused for the new installation to be the property of the John H. McGowan Company, who will ship it to Cincinnati.

We will supply you and install a suitable motor driven vacuum pump for your low head pump, net \$200⁰⁰.

You are to ship to us by prepaid freight the Harris Pump and base plate, as well as flexible coupling which is to remain your property until sold by us, it to be listed through all of our agency offices. We will credit you with full amount of the net sales price when pump is disposed of and send you our check to cover.

In connection with the purchasing of the vacuum pump, if we can secure a suitable unit that we would recommend for your service at a price less than \$2000⁰⁰ we will also send you our check for the difference in the prices represented.
