

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville,
Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky,
on the 15th day of December, 1925, the following were present:
Mayor, W. K. Steele, and Councilmen, S. M. Herford, A. J. Akers,
R. B. Johnson, L. G. Duty and S. H. Fields.

The minutes of the meeting of December 1st, 1925, were read and
approved.

The street committee recommended that two new lights be installed as
follows: one at Len Robinson's residence and one at Lawrence Comp-
ton's residence and that one in head of street be changed about forty
feet from its present location in order to light more territory all
at upper end of South College Street and road or street immediately
beyond. R. B. Johnson moved that said lights be installed and
recommended that Kentucky & West Virginia Power Company
be directed to install same accordingly. S. M. Herford sec-
onded said motion which carried, by the following ayes and
nay vote: S. M. Herford, yes; A. J. Akers, yes; R. B. Johnson, yes;
S. H. Fields, yes; L. G. Duty, yes.

The Mayor appointed as a committee on streets, alleys and passways for the ensuing term, A. J. Akers and L. A. Duty.

O The Mayor appointed as a committee on Fire and Water Department for the ensuing term, S. H. Fields.

The Mayor appointed as a committee on public service corporations for the ensuing term, S. M. Herford and R. S. Johnson.

O The Mayor appointed A. F. Childers, City Attorney, John M. Hatchett, City Clerk and W. King Walker, City Engineer, as a committee to draft an ordinance relating to existing buildings in city of Pikeville, and appointment of inspectors therefor, to be presented at next regular meeting.

The Mayor requested A. F. Childers, City Attorney, to prepare and present to Council at next regular meeting, an ordinance relating to licensing in city of Pikeville.

The Mayor appointed as a "budget" committee to report at next meeting of Council, S. M. Herford, S. H. Fields and L. A. Duty.

W. S. Griffith presented his certificate of election to the Office of City Engineer which was filed, and W. S. Griffith appeared in open Council and took the oath of Office as City Engineer of Pikeville, Kentucky, as required by law.

Walter Hatcher appeared in open council and took the oath of office as City Treasurer of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, also required by law.

Walter Hatcher presented bond in the sum of \$10,000.00 as City Treasurer of Pikeville, Kentucky, with American Surety Company of New York, as surety, which is in words and figures as follows:

money in his hands due the city to any person designated by the
Board of Council.

at a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 29th day of December, 1925, the following were present: Mayor W. K. Steele and councilman, S. H. Fields, S. M. Harpford, L. A. Duty, A. J. Akers, and R. S. Johnson.

The minutes of the meeting of December 15, 1925, were read and approved.

It appearing that J. G. Parker, duly elected as a member of the Common Council at the regular November election, 1925, has failed and refused to qualify, and a vacancy being declared, S. H. Fields nominated E. S. Shurtleff as a member of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, to fill the unexpired term and vacancy caused by the failure of J. G. Parker to qualify. A. J. Akers nominated E. M. Hatfield to fill the said office. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

S. H. Fields.	for E. S. Shurtleff.
A. J. Akers.	for E. M. Hatfield.
S. M. Harpford.	for E. M. Hatfield.
R. S. Johnson.	not voting.
L. A. Duty.	for E. M. Hatfield.

The vote standing three for Hatfield and one for Shurtleff, the mayor declared E. M. Hatfield duly appointed and elected to fill the unexpired term of J. G. Parker, who failed to qualify.

E. M. Hatfield appeared in open council and accepted said office, took the oath of office as such as required by law and assumed the duties as councilman of the City of Pikeville.

The street committee made report and recommended that Fourth and Fifth streets be located by the city engineer from end of present pavement to river; and that part of Kentucky Avenue be located

by city engineer where Phillips Hytton has barn and fence, and that the city engineer report to the council at its next regular meeting.

S. H. Fields moved that the above report of the street committee be received, and that the city engineer carry out the recommendations contained therein. L. A. Duty seconded said motion, which carried.

(O) The mayor appointed E. M. Hatfield as a member of Committee on Fire and Water Department.

The street committee filed report and recommended that certain parties named therein be directed by the City Council to clean up streets and side walks in front of their property; keep barns clean abutting streets and alleys, et al.

S. H. Fields moved that the above report be accepted, and that the police department be directed to notify each party mentioned therein of the fact that he is violating the law and upon his failure to correct said evil in reasonable length of time that the policemen will make application before police judge for warrant. A. J. Akers seconded said motion, which carried.

The committee appointed at meeting of December 15, 1925 to draft ordinance relating to wiring buildings in City of Pikeville, and appointment of inspector therefor presented said ordinance, upon motion made, duly seconded and carried said matter is passed over to next meeting for examination of said ordinance.

It appearing that Drs. R. S. Johnson, O. W. Thompson and E. D. Stephenson, Horace Wright, and others, heretofore obtaining permit from City of Pikeville to and did install a private water line in that part of the city known as "Clin addition" at an expense to them of \$408⁴¹, and it further appearing that the City of Pikeville appropriated said private system for its own use and is now operating same.

Upon motion of S. H. Fields duly seconded by S. M. Harpford and carried. It is ordered that said parties, who installed said system, to wit Dr. O. W. Thompson, Dr. R. S. Johnson, E. D. Stephenson, Horace Wright, Tom Marshall, Ed Murphy, Ben Childers, Sidney Trivette, George Pinson, W. Will, E. T. St. H. Wright, Ed Bailey and Joe Justice or their successors in title, be and they are each hereby allowed the sum of \$31⁴² to be credited upon water bills, provided said parties execute proper conveyance to the city for their rights in said water line. Said \$408⁴¹ is to be charged to Pikeville Water Works department.

X Walter Robinson chief of Police dept presented bond as such in the sum of \$2500.00 with National Surety Company of New York and Surety, upon motion of S. H. Fields, duly seconded by A. J. Akers and carried, said bond was accepted and approved.
