Said Contract above referred to and entered into by the City Council on behalf of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, is as follows:

"THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this the 26th day of February, 1927, by and between Green Charles and Pricy Jane Charles, his wife, parties of the first part, and the City of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, party of the second part:

WITNESSETH: That the parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the party of the second part herein paying and assuming to pay the balance due on street paving charged against the parties of the first part by the Campbell-on street paving charged against the parties of the intersection of Scott Avenue Johnson Construction Company for paving done at the intersection of Scott Avenue and Main Street, and for the further consideration of the covenants, agreement and stipulations herein set forth, does hereby bargain, sell, grant and convey and stipulations herein set forth, does hereby bargain, sell, grant and convey and stipulations herein set forth, does hereby bargain, privileges and easements:

That the said City of Pikeville shall have the privilege of dumping earth, dirt, rocks and any firm or durable material for the purpose of filling and repairing the street at the intersection of Scott Avenue and Main Street upon the following described property, to-wit:

All that property next to the river adjacent to Main Street near the intersection of the same with Scott Avenue and in front of the residence of the parties of the first part.

It is further understood and agreed by the parties hereto that the City of Pikeville shall have the right to enter upon said property and to drive piling thereon in any manner sufficient to reinforce, support and build up the bank of a sufficient strength and width to repair the street and curb in front of the residence of the party of the first part.

It is further understood and agreed by the parties hereto that as soon as the curb in the street is repaired and rebuilt that the party of the second part shall have no further right to enter upon or to dump any material upon the said property without the consent of the parties of the first part, their heirs or assigns, unless said repairs should at some time again give way and endanger the street at said point, and then in that event the party of the second part shall have the right to re-enter and repair said street within a reasonable length of time after giving way.

And it is distinctly understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the City of Pikeville shall not dump, or permit to be dumped, any material upon said property which will create a public, or a private, nusiance; nor shall the City of Pikeville dump, or permit to be dumped, any papers, cans or any material of an unsightly nature. It is further understood and agreed by the parties hereto that the City of Pikeville, or those whom it permits to dump upon said property, shall throw over the bank all materials for filling, or cause the same property, shall throw over the bank all materials for filling, and that the said to be done, without expense to the parties of the first part, and that the said second party shall not permit dirt or material to pile up in heaps above the level of the street curbing.

The party of the second part shall have the right for the purpose of making the fill to support the curb, or street, to enter upon and dump dirt for said purpose for a period of \_\_\_\_years.

Councilman, S.M. Hereford moved that the Committee on Public Utilities notify the Kentucky &. W.Va. Power Company, to move two lights, that will be marked out by the said Committee, from their present position to a position on the hill near the Methodist Hospital, in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, in order that the lighting power may be increased around the Hospital grounds, and said motion being duly seconded by Millard Burke, carried unanimously.

The Committee appointed to confer with and secure bids from Auditors on an Audit of the books of the Water Department of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and an Audit of the Books and records of the City of Pikeville, makes its report, and states that Capt. Roberts, can be secured for make an Audit of the Water Dept., and also of the records of the City of Pikeville, up to January 1st, 1927, for the sum of \$150.00, and on motion made, seconded and carried, said report is accepted and approved.

Councilman, S.H. Fields, moved that Capt.
