

# MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the City Hall of said city on the 15th day of March, 1927, the following were present: Mayor, J.P. Marrs; Councilmen, A.J. Akers, Millard Burke, S.M. Hereford, Ed Wells, and Richard Thompson:

The minutes of the former meeting, held on the 1st day of March, 1927, are read and approved by the Council.

The written resignation of Councilman, S.H. Fields, is presented to the Council, and read and marked filed.

Councilman, Richard Thompson, nominated A.M. Phipps, as Councilman of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and there being no other nominations made, upon the vote being taken, the Mayor declared the said A.M. Phipps, elected as Councilman:

The said A.M. Phipps, being present in open Council accepted said office and took the oath of office as Councilman, as required by law, and entered upon his duties as such.

W.K. Steele, appeared before the Council and made request that the Council exonerate J.P. Cline of certain tax tickets held by the City against him for the year 1922, and the matter being investigated it appears that an order of this kind was entered by a former Council of this city, and the further consideration of this matter is postponed until it is ascertained whether the relief asked for herein has been granted.

R.L. Fields appeared before the Council and asked that he be exonerated on tax ticket for the year 1926, held by the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, in the sum of \$600.00, and upon motion of S.M. Hereford, duly seconded and carried, the city Attorney is directed to investigate the request of R.L. Fields and make a report on same to the council at its next regular meeting, and the further consideration of Mr. R.L. Fields' request is postponed until that time.

The Committeeman, P.B. Stratton, appointed to give legal advice on the question, relative to the Salary of the City Attorney, appears before the Council and asks that he be given until the next regular meeting of the Council in which to make his report, which request is granted.

The Committee appointed to consider the request of Ferrell Johnson, for an increase in Salary as Pump Operator for the water department, reports that this Committee cannot grant any salary increases, and that the only way in which this can be done, is for the Supt. of the Water Dept. J.J. Stone, to recommend that the increase be made and the Council may confirm the request.

Councilman, Millard Burke moves that the Salary of J.J. Stone, Supt. of the water Department, be reduced from \$200.00 per month to \$150.00 per month, and asks that the consideration of this matter be postponed until the next regular meeting of the Council.

The Settlement made by the City Clerk, with the Supt. of the Water Department, for the month of January, 1927, is presented, read, approved and ordered filed.

The Settlement made by the City Clerk, with the Police Judge for the month of February, 1927, is presented to the Council, read approved and ordered filed.

The Settlement made by the City Clerk, with the Chief of Police for the month of February, 1927, is presented to the Council, read, approved and ordered filed.

Councilman, S.M. Hereford, introduced an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE CHANGING AND FIXING STANDARD TIME OF CITY OF PIKEVILLE, PIKE COUNTY, KENTUCKY" and moved the adoption of same by the City Council, and said motion being duly seconded by Councilman, A.J. Akers, and upon roll call of the Council, the vote was as follows:

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Councilman, S.M. Hereford introduced an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DRIVING OF WAGONS, TRUCKS, AUTOMOBILES OR OTHER MOTORE VEHICLES, OR INSTRUMENTS OR MATERIAL OVER SIDE WALKS, OR STREET OR ALLEY CURBS IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE PIKE COUNTY, KENTUCKY." and moved that the consideration of this Ordinance be postponed until the next meeting of the Council, which is done.

Councilman, S.M. Hereford introduced an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING OF MOTORVEHICLES ON SECOND STREET", and moved its adoption, and upon a roll call of the Council the vote was as follows:

The Southern Bell Telephone & Telegraph Co. be allowed the sum of One and 50/100 (\$1.50) for service calls by the Pikeville Police Department for the month of January and February, 1927.

ORDERED THAT:

Eugene Purvey be allowed the sum of Two and 50/100 (\$2.50) Dollars, for painting three parking signs for Second Street. as per bill rendered.

ORDERED THAT:

T.N. Huffman Coal Company be allowed the sum of Three and 50/100 (\$3.50) for one load of coal for Police Station. as per bill of 3-9-27

ORDERED THAT:

G.C. Honaker, be allowed the sum of Two (\$2.00) Dollars, for repairing Water lines in Police Station, as per bill rendered.
