The minutes of the Council at all former meetings not heretofore read and approved, are now read and approved by the Council.

Thomas E. Newton, Supt. of Water Dept. presents bond with the Maryland Casualty Company, in the sum of Three Thousand (\$3000.00) Dollars, and Councilman S.M. Hereford moved that said bond be accepted and approved, and said motion being duly seconded, upon a roll call of the Council, the vote was as follows:

THIS BOND is executed by the Surety upon the following express conditions, which shall be a condition precedent to the right of recovery hereunder.

IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BETWEEN ALL PARTIES HERETO, that if the Surety shall so elect, this bond may be cancelled by giving thirty (30) days notice in writing to the said Thomas Newtom and this bond shall be deemed cancelled at the expiration of said thirty (30) days, the said Surety remaining liable for all or any act or acts covered by this bond, which may have been committed by the Principal up to the date of such cancellation, under the terms, conditions and provisions of this bond, and the Surety shall, upon surrender of this bond and its release from all liability thereunder, refund the premium paid, less a prorata part thereof, for the time this bond shall have been in force.

Said contract is in words and figures as follows, To-wit:

"This Contract made and entered into by and between the City of Pikeville, party of the first part and Thos Newton, party of the second part, witnesseth, that the party of the first part hereby employs party of the second part as Superintendent of the City Water Department, for the period of one month, and to continue from month to month, until the contract is terminated by action if the council, or a resignation by second party.

The Contract price for said service is \$150.00 per month.

The second party's duties as Superintendent, is to look over and keep in proper order the machinery, and appurtenances; to see that all water users are properly charged, and the charges collected for water; to keep proper and correct books of accounts and to carry out and into effect all rules, and regulations and ordinances enacted by the City Council for the water department, that may have heretofore been enacted or that may hereafter be enacted; to account for and pay over to the Treasurer of the City of Pikeville, all sums collected, taking his receipt therefor. The settlements to be made on the second meeting of the Council of each calendar month, for the collections, made to that date.

All rules and regulations, prescribed by the council, for the regulation, of the water department is made part hereof the same as if written out in full herein.

The party of the second part is required to execute a bond in the sum of \$3000.00 for the faithful performance of his duties including the accounting of all moeys that comes into his hands by reason of this contract.

Phipps, Councilman, for the alleged reason, that Mr. Phipps had not been a resident of the City for six months, and it appearing that there was no notice given of the intention to remove or expel Mr. Phipps; that Mr. Phipps had been regularly elected and qualified as a member; that the law requires at least three fourths of the votes of all the mambers to remove or expel a member, I am of the opinion that the vote taken on the question of removal, in so far as it removed Mr. Phipps, is null and void; that while I am of the opinion that it is null and void, I do also hereby vetoe the said bill and motion to remove said councilman; the clerk is directed to record this vetoe, on the minutes of the council. viven under my hand this April 18th, 1927.
