

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a special called meeting of the City Council, for the purpose of appointing some person to select a place to dump the garbage that was accumulating in the city of Pikeville, Ky., as there is being much complaint that no place could be secured. The following Councilmen were present: Millard Burke, Ed Wells, A.M. Phipps and Jack Akers, and by agreement of Council, Walter Robinson, was appointed to secure a place where same could be dumped, and now reports that he made arrangements with John Scott, Admr., of the Martha Cline heirs, and he says that the garbage for the present could be dumped at the mouth of the Poor farm branch, just above the railroad, and further arrangements will be made with reference to a permanent dumping ground when the council and the man selected, has further time, in which to arrange same.

On motion made seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date, July 19th, 1927.
