

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Ky., convened and held at the city hall on the 6th day of September, 1927, in said city, the following were present: Mayor, J.P. Marrs; Councilmen A.J. Akers, Millard Burke, S.M. Hereford, A.M. Phipps, Ed Wells and Richard Thompson:

The minutes of all former meetings of the Council not read and approved, are now read and approved by the City Council and signed and attested by the clerk.

The resignation of W.V. Young, as Policeman, is presented and read to the Council, and upon motion of Millard Burke, duly seconded by Ed Wells, and carried unanimously, said resignation is accepted.

Said Resignation is in words and figures as follows: "TO THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE: I hereby resign as Policeman of the City of Pikeville, to take effect Sept. 1st, 1927; all of which you will take due notice, this August 24th, 1927.

Councilman, Ed Wells, nominated Leston Justice, as Deputy Chief of Police of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and there being no further nominations made,, upon a roll call of the Council the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced by the Clerk, the Mayor thereupon declared the said Leston Justice, elected as Deputy Chief of Police of the City of Pikeville, Ky.,

The said Leston Justice, being present in open Council, accepted said office of Deputy Chief of Police of the City of Pikeville, Ky., and took the oath as required by law and entered upon his duties as such Policeman.

Thereupon Leston Justice, presented bynd signed by the National Surety Company, in the sum of \$2500.00, and upon motion made seconded and carried, said bond is approved and ordered filed.

Said bond is in words and figures to-wit:

"KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, LESTON JUSTICE, as principal, and the NATIONAL SURETY COMPANY, of New York, a corporation of the State of New York, having its principal office in the City of New York, and authorized to do business in the state of Kentucky, as surety, are held and firmly bound unto Commonwealth of Kentucky for the benefit of Pikeville, Kentucky in the penalty of Twenty Five Hundred (\$2500.00) Dollars, to the payment whereof, well and truly to be made and done, the said Principal binds himself, his heirs, executors and administrators, and the said Surety binds itself, its successors and assigns, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

SIGNED, sealed and dates this 31st day of August A.D. 1927.

THE CONDITION OF THE AFOREGOING OBLIGATION IS SUCH, that WHEREAS the said Principal was duly elected or appointed to the office or position of Deputy Chief of Police, for the term beginning September 6th, 1927 and ending September 6th, 1929 or until his successor is elected or appointed and qualifies.

NOW THEREFORE, if the said Principal shall well and truly perform all the duties of his said office or position, and shall pay over and account for all funds coming into his hands by virtue of his said office or position as required by law, then this obligation shall be null and void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue.

THIS BOND is executed and delivered upon the following express conditions, which shall be conditions precedent to the right of recovery hereunder:

FIRST: If the Surety shall so elect this bond may be cancelled by giving thirty (30) days' notice in writing to the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and this bond shall be deemed cancelled at the expiration of said thirty (30) days, the Surety remaining liable for all or any act or acts covered by this bond, which may have been committed by the Principal up to the date of such cancellation, under the terms, conditions and provisions of this bond, and the Surety shall upon surrender of this bond and its release from all liability hereunder, refund the premium paid, less a pro-rata part thereof, for the time this bond shall have been in force.

SECOND: The surety shall not be liable hereunder for any loss sustained by reason of the failure or any bank or banks, depository or depositaries in which public moneys are now on general or special deposit or may hereafter be placed on general or special deposit or by on behalf of the said Principal, any Law, Decision, Statute or Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

THIRD: The liability under this bond shall commence from September 6th, 1927, and the Surety hereunder shall in no event be held liable in respect to any act or acts of the said Principal committed prior to the said date or for any shortage existing prior to the said date, or for funds or property used or applied towards such shortage.

FOURTH: The Surety shall not be liable hereunder for any loss or losses resulting by reason of the failure of the said Principal to collect any portion of or all taxes which he may be chargeable to collect by reason of his election or appointment to the office or position aforesaid.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the said Principal has hereunto set his hand and seal and the said Surety has caused this instrument of writing to be signed by its Resident Vice-President, attested by Resident Assistant Secretary, and its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed the day and year first above written.
