At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held on the 25th day of November, 1927, at the City Hall in said city, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., and Councilmen, Millard Burke and Richard Thompson A.J. Akers and S.M. Hereford.

City Tax Collector, W.B. Syck, appeared in open council, and presented bond to the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, with the National Surety Company, in the sum of Five Thousand (\$5000.00) Dollars, of date Nov. 15th, 1927, and upon motion duly made and seconded and carried, said bond is approved by the City Council.

(Said bond is in words and figures to-wit:)

"KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, WILLIAM B. SYCK as Principal, and the NATIONAL SURETY COMPANY of New York, a corporation of the State of New York, having its principal office in the City of New York, and authorized to do business in the State of Kentucky are held and firmly bound unto CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, in the penalty of FIVE THOUSAND & 00/100 (\$5000.00) Dollars, to the payment whereof, well and truly to be made and done, the said Principal binds himself, his heirs, executors and administrators, and the said Surety binds itself, its successors and assigns, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

SIGNED, sealed and dated this 15th day of November, A.D. 1927.

THE CONDITION OF THE AFOREGOING OBLIGATION IS SUCH, that WHEREAS, the said Principal was duly elected or appointed to the office or position of City Tax Collector, for the term beginning November 15th, 1927 and ending November 15th, 1929 or until his successor is elected or appointed and qualifies.

NOW THEREFORE, if the said Principal shall well and truly perform all the duties of his said office or position, and shall pay over and account for all funds coming into his hands by virtue of his said office or position as required by law, then this obligation shall be null and void, otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue.

THIS BOND is executed and delivered upon the following express conditions, which shall be conditions precedent to the right of recovery hereunder:

FIRST --- If the Surety shall so elect this bond may be cancelled by giving thirty (30) days notice in writing to the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and this bond shall be deemed cancelled at the expiration of said thirty (30) days, the Surety remaining liable for all or any act or acts covered by this bond, which may have been committed by the Principal up to the date of such cancellation, under the terms, conditions and provisions of this bond, and the Surety shall upon surrender of this bond and its release from all liability hereunder, refund the premium paid, less a prorata part thereof, for the time this bond shall have been in force.

SECOND - The Surety shall not be liable hereunder for any loss sustained by reason of the failure of any bank or banks, depository or depositories in which public moneys are now on general or special deposit or may hereafter be placed on general or special deposit by or on behalf of the said Principal, any Law, Decision, Statute or Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

THIRD-----The liability under this bond shall commence from November 15th 1927 and the Surety hereunder shall in no event be held liable in respect to any act or acts of the said Principal committed prior to the said date or for any shortage existing prior to the said date, or for funds or property used or applied towards such shortage.

FOURTH- - The Surety shall not be liable hereunder for any loss or losses resulting by reason of the failure of the said Principal to collect any portion of or all taxes which he may be chargeable to collect by reason of his election or appointment to the office or position aforesaid.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the said Principal has hereunto set his hand and seal and the said Surety has caused this instrument of writing to be signed by its Resident Vice-President, attested by its Resident ~~Surety~~-he Assistant Secretary, and its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed the day and year first above written.
