

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a special called meeting of the Common Council, of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, called for the purpose of considering the permit asked for by the Standard Oil Company, convened and held in the city hall on the 30th day of March, 1928, the following were present; Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, Richard Thompson, Rush Sword, A.J. Jackson, E.E. Trivette, I.E. Brooks, and B.A. Ratliff.

Hon. J.P. Hobson Jr., representing the Standard Oil Company, presented an Ordinance, which was read to the council, and after discussion, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the further consideration of the Ordinance was postponed until the next regular meeting date.

On motion made, seconded and carried, council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date, April 3rd, 1928.

At the regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall of said city, on the 3rd day of April, 1928, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, I.E. Brooks, Oscar Jackson, B.A. Ratliff, Rush Sword, and Richard Thompson.

The minutes of the former Council Meeting, held on the 23rd day of March, 1928, are read and approved.

Councilman, E.E. Trivette, now present.

The Committee appointed to investigate the lighting conditions on Julius Avenue, asks that it be given until the next meeting in which to make final report on said conditions, which are granted.

Upon motion made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that the City Treasurer, pay out the money coming into his hands as such, from the Special Levy for the year 1927, as follows:

That he shall pay to Kelley Bros., in satisfaction of bonds and judgment against the city, five ninths (5/9) of said amount, and, that he shall pay to the Clerk of the Pike Circuit Court, on the judgment of the Sandy Valley Light & Power Company, and the Mountain Water Company, against the city of Pikeville, four ninths (4/9) of said amount, and he is directed to continue to pay out the money coming into his hands from this source, at the same ratio and in the same manner as herein set out, until all of said judgments, interest and costs, have been satisfied.

On motion made, seconded and carried, the Street Committee is directed to investigate and report, to the Council, on the cost of repairing the paving on Cline Street, near about 8th street, at its next regular meeting.

On motion made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that T.O. Robinson be exonerated from paying the taxes charged against him for the year 1927, by the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the reason that said property, for which he is charged, has been charged against J.E. Mattingly, for the same year, and has been paid by him.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks, moved that, Whereas, the present Caretaker of the fire station having resigned or quit, that Bennie England be employed as Caretaker of the Fire Station, at a Salary of \$3.00 per day, subject to the orders of the Council, and to give 24 hour service, said motion being duly seconded by Rush Sword, and upon roll call, carried by a unanimous vote.

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The Street Committee is directed to take up and report on the Street cleaning conditions, and they will make a report of their findings at the next meeting of the Council:

Ieston Justice be allowed the sum of One Hundred Twenty Five (\$125.00) Dollars, for Salary as Deputy Chief of Police for month of March, 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

J.M. Hatcher be allowed the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, for salary as City Attorney for month of March 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

T.J. Kendrick be allowed the sum of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars, for Salary as Police Judge for month of March 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

T.J. Kendrick be allowed the sum of Forty (\$40.00) Dollars, for salary as clerk hire for Police Judge for month of March 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

Walter Hatcher be allowed the sum of Twelve and 50/100 (\$12.50) Dollars, for salary as City Treasurer, for month of March, 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

W.T. Griffith be allowed the sum of Two and 50/100 (\$2.50) Dollars, for salary as City ~~Treasurer~~ Engineer, for month of March, 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

Earl & John Scott be allowed the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, for cleaning streets for month of March 1928, as per contract.

ORDERED THAT:

Ky. & W.Va. Power Company, be allowed the sum of Three Hundred Nine and 38/100 (\$309.38) Dollars, for power for street lights for March 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

J.E. Sanders be allowed the sum of Eighty Nine and 40/100 (\$89.40) Dollars, for Salary and services as City Clerk for March, 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

J.E. Sanders, be allowed the sum of Three and 50/100 (\$3.50) For certified copies of orders in case of Butler Bales vs. City of Pikeville, Kentucky.

ORDERED THAT:

Herman Polley be allowed the sum of Ninety Three (\$93.00) Dollars, for salary as Caretaker for fire station for month of March, 1928, for 31 days at \$3.00 per day.

ORDERED THAT:

W.B. Syck be allowed the sum of Fifty Five and 63/100 (\$55.63) Dollars, for salary as tax collector for collection on \$3709.97, @ 1 1/2 % Commission.

ORDERED THAT:

T.J. Kendrick be allowed the sum of Eighty Seven (\$87.00) Dollars, for Salary ~~as~~ Herman Polley as caretaker of fire station for Feb. 1928, and attached in Police Court in case of S.D. Reynolds vs. Herman Polley.

ORDERED THAT:

Lumberland Publishing Company be allowed the sum of Fifty Seven and 20/100 (\$57.20) Dollars, for invoice up to March 31, 1928, for supplies.

ORDERED THAT:

D.C. Moore, Former Circuit Court Clerk, be allowed the sum of Eighteen and 50/100 (\$18.50) Dollars, as cost in case of City of Pikeville & Councilmen, vs. A.M. Phipps, in Pike Circuit Court.

ORDERED THAT:

T.E. Newton be allowed the sum of One Hundred and Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars, for salary as Supt. of Water Dept. for month of march, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

A.S. Corbin be allowed the sum of One Hundred and Twenty Five (\$125.00) Dollars, for salary as pump operator for month of March, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Ky. & W. Va. Power Company be allowed the sum of Three Hundred Twenty Four and 32/100 (\$324.32) Dollars, for power furnished the water department for month of March, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

The Chemical National Bank be allowed the sum of Eight and 52/100 (\$8.52) Dollars, for Commission for paying pikeville city coupons, from Oct. 1, 1927, to March 1, 1928, amounting to \$3410.00, @ $\frac{1}{4}$ of 1% Commission. Payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

T.E. Newton be allowed the sum of One Hundred Ninety Three and 24/100 (\$193.24) Dollars, for Current expense account of Supt. of water Dept. for March, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Foster Thornburg H&W. Co. be allowed the sum of Two Hundred Seventy Four and 39/100 (\$274.39) Dollars, for supplies furnished to water Dept. as per invoices of 7-22; 8-3; 8-3-27; and 3-19-28, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

H.W. Clark Company be allowed the sum of Fifty Five (\$55.00) Dollars, for 20 Type 3B Clark Meter Coupling yokes, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

The Pikeville Supply & Planing Mill Company be allowed the sum of Seventeen and 50/100 (\$17.50) Dollars, for 25 bags of lime as per bill of 3-26-1928, payable out of the water fund.
