

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held on the 5th day of April, 1928, at the City Hall in said city, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, I.E. Brooks, Oscar Jackson, Rush Sword, E.E. Trivette, and Richard Thompson.

A resolution from the City Board of Education is presented and read, certifying the result of the election on the School Bonds in the sum of \$65,000.00, and upon motion made, seconded and carried, said resolution is filed, and ordered spread at large on its minute book.

"RESOLUTION"

" At a meeting of the Board of Education of the City of Pikeville, held at its office in Pikeville on April 2nd, 1928, present, W.M. Ramsey, Chairman, J.M. Johnson, A.R. Venters, M.D. Flanary, A.S. Corbin and George Coleman, members.

It appearing from the certificate of the vote as certified by the County Board of Election Commissioners of Pike County that the vote in favor of the bond issue was 703 and the vote against said bond issue was 209; that more than two thirds of the voters of the said School District voted in favor of the issual of the School Improvement bonds, and it further appearing that the present term of school is nearing its close and it being desirous to have necessary additional school buildings ready for occupancy and use for the beginning of the schools in 1928, and pursuant to Section 3587-A-20, Kentucky Statutes, it is therefore certified by the City Council of the City of Pikeville and to the Pike County Fiscal Court that it is desired that school bonds aforesaid, be issued for the purposes set out in the order of this Board and in the Ordinance; that it is desired to sell said bonds during the next ten days at either public or private sale at not less than par and to draw interest at a rate not in excess of five (5) percent, semi-annually.

That said bonds to bear date of May 1, 1928; that there shall be sixty-five (65) one thousand dollar coupon bonds, three of which are to mature on the first day of May of each calendar year until forty-five of said bonds mature; that thereafter four of said bonds to become due on the first day of May of each calendar year thereafter until the remaining twenty bonds mature; that the coupons may be detached and presented with the matured bonds at the date same are due or at any time when said interest is payable the same to be paid at the Day & Night National Bank of Pikeville, Said bonds to be delivered to the Board of Education of the City of Pikeville for the purpose of disposing of same, as required by law.

The City Council of the City of Pikeville and the Pike County Fiscal Court are requested to pass such Ordinance or Orders as may be necessary for a levy of twenty (20) cents on each \$100.00 of taxable property for the purpose of providing a sinking fund to retire said bonds and the interest at maturity thereof. The tax rate for said purpose to be uniform in the corporate limits of the City of Pikeville and the territory embraced in said school district lying outside of said corporate limits.

An Ordinance, entitled "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUAL OF SIXTY FIVE \$1,000.00 SERIAL COUPON BONDS DESIGNATED SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT BONDS BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PIKEVILLE GRADED SCHOOL DISTRICT TO BE USED FOR THE BUILDING RECONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT OF SCHOOL PROPERTY AND EQUIPPING THE SAME, AND PROVIDING THE TIME FOR PAYMENT OF THE SAME, TOGETHER WITH INTEREST THEREON." is presented and read to the City Council, and Councilman, E.E. Trivette, moved the adoption of same, said motion being duly seconded by Richard Thompson, upon a roll call of the Council, the vote was as follows:

Duty be employed, in the place of Leson Justice, as Policeman, and said motions being duly seconded, by Oscar Jackson, upon a roll call of the Council, the vote was as follows:




