

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular ~~XXXX~~ adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held on the 19th day of April, 1928, at the City Hall in said city, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, I.E. Brooks, Oscar Jackson, Rush Sword, B.A. Ratliff, and Richard Thompson.

Hon. T.H. Harman, appeared before the Council and asked for a permit to be granted to the Pikeville College, to change the present location of Sycamore Street, through the property of the Pikeville College, said change to be made according to a map made by the city engineer, and filed with the Council, and Councilman, Rush Sword, moved that said permit be granted, and said motion being duly seconded by I.E. Brooks, carried by a unanimous vote.

Councilman, Richard Thompson, moved that the further consideration of the sale of Lighting Franchise, asked for by the Kentucky & W.Va. Power Company, be postponed until the next regular meeting of the Council, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Councilman, E.E. Trivette, now present.

The Committee appointed to investigate and report on the lighting conditions on Julius Avenue, makes its report to the Council, as follows: That there is 13 lights that can be removed from their present locations, without inconvenience to the parties and public, and be moved to Julius Avenue (10 of said light), and one placed at the end of the bridge on 7th street, and two on the approach to the bridge at the upper end of town, at a cost to the city of approximately, \$100.00, and they further report that the 10 lights are needed on Julius Avenue, as they have not lights on said street whatever. That is the part of the street leading from the pavement up to Peach Orchard Hill.

Councilman, B.A. Ratliff, moved that the further consideration of the placing of lights on Julius Avenue, be postponed until after the new lighting Franchise matter has been adjusted, and said motion being duly seconded by E.E. Trivette, carried by a unanimous vote.

ORDERED THAT:

The Eureka Fire Hose Mfg. Co. be allowed the sum of Two Hundred Thirty Eighty and 60/100 (\$238.60) Dollars, for interest on account and bill up to date, as per letter of April 13th, 1928, being for interest and accounts against fire station.

On motion made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until the next Regular meeting, date, May 1st, 1928.
