

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held on May 4th, 1928, at the city hall in said city, the following were present, Geo. Pinson Jr., Mayor, Rush Sword, Earl Brooks, Oscar Jackson, and Richard Thompson, Councilmen.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING CIRCUS AND MENAGERIE LICENSE IN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, AND WITHIN ONE HALF MILE OF THE LIMITS THEREOF", is presented and read to the Council, and I.E. Brooks, moved the adoption of same, and said motion being duly seconded by Oscar Jackson, upon a roll call of the Council, the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced by the clerk, the Mayor declared said motion carried, and said ordinance adopted.

On motion made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that the street light, on the light pole, at the store house of Burgess & Crawford, on Cline Street, be moved from its present location, and placed on the pole, at the end of the bridge across the river, at the end of 7th street.

On motion made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that J.P. Morris, be exonerated from paying the poll tax charged against him for the year 1927, as same was made through error, in charging him with poll tax, as he is over the age limit, at which a poll tax is to be charged for city purposes.

On motion made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that Howard Burpo, be exonerated from paying the taxes charged against him by the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the year 1926, for the reason that the said Howard Burpo, did not live in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, at the time the assessment for city purposes was made, for said year.

On motion made, seconded and carried, the tax adjustment asked for by W.D. Bartley, is referred to the city clerk and he will make an investigation and report on same at the next meeting of the Board of Council, and the tax collector is directed to withhold sale on same, until the matter is adjusted.

ORDERED THAT:

J.E. Sanders, Treas. be allowed the sum of Twenty Eight and 33/100 (\$28.33) Dollars, for service of Mell McCoy as fireman for 4 months and attending 10 fires @ \$2.00 each, and said claim being paid by J.E. Sanders, in order that the said Mell McCoy's tax matters might be adjusted.

On motion made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date, May 15th, 1928.
