

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held on the 15th day of May, 1928, at the city hall in said city, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, Oscar Jackson, B.A. Ratliff, E.E. Trivette and Richard Thompson.

The minutes of all former meetings not heretofore read and approved, are now read, and approved by the Council.

Councilman, Rush Sword, now present.

The City Clerk makes oral report on the tax matters of the Pikeville Supply & Planing Mill Company, and upon motion, made, seconded and carried, the further consideration of this matter is referred to a committee, and they will make an investigation of same and report their findings at the next meeting of the Board.

The Mayor, appointed on the committee, to investigate the tax matters of the Pikeville Planing Mill Co., Councilmen, Richard Thompson, E.E. Trivette, and Oscar Jackson, J.M. Hatcher, City Attorney and J.E. Sanders, City Attorney.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Harman, Francis & Hobson shall be permitted to appear with the City Attorney, but they are to make no bill for same against the city or the Mayor or Councilmen."

Richard Thompson be allowed the sum of Three and 50/100 (\$3.50) Dollars, for work of L.S. Dempsey in cleaning dumping ground and paid for by Richard Thompson.

ORDERED THAT:

O.O. Graham be allowed the sum of Twelve (\$12.00) Dollars, for Frank Lark, as fireman in attending 6 fires @ \$2.00 each, and paid by O.O. Graham.

ORDERED THAT:

Geo. S. Thornbury be allowed the sum of Three and 50/100 (\$3.50) Dollars, for work in cleaning off dumping ground for city, for garbage.

On motion made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date,
