An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING, AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING AN ORDINANCE POSTED DECEMBER6, 1921, AND ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE KEEPING, STORAGE, USING, SELLING OR OTHER DISPOSITION OF GASOLINE, NAPTHA OR OTHER HIGHLY INFLAMABLE LIQUIDS", is presented and read to the Council, and E.E. Trivette moved the adoption of same, and said motion being duly seconded by Rush Sword, upon a roll call of the Council, the vote was as follows:

On motion made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until June 7th, at 7:30 o'clock, 1928.
