

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

adjourned

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held on the 6th day of June, 1928, at the city hall, in said city, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, I.E. Brooks, Oscar Jackson, B.A. Ratliff, Rush Sword, E.E. Trivette, and Richard Thompson.

On motion made, seconded and carried, the reading of the minutes is postponed until the next meeting.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REPEALING, AMENDING AND RE-ENACTING AN ORDINANCE POSTED DECEMBER 6, 1921, AND ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE KEEPING, STORAGE, USING, SELLING OR OTHER DISPOSITION OF GASOLINE, NAPHTHA OR OTHER HIGHLY INFLAMMABLE LIQUIDS", is presented and read to the Council, and E.E. Trivette moved the adoption of same, and said motion being duly seconded by Rush Sword, upon a roll call of the Council, the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced by the clerk, the Mayor thereupon declared said motion carried and said ordinance adopted.

Hon. T.W. Oliver appeared before the city Council and asked for a permit to be granted to the City Board of Education, to move a building from its present site, near the Pikeville Graded School, across Scott Avenue, to a location selected, and upon motion made, seconded and carried, same is granted.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks, moved that the city enter into a contract with Code Ramsey, as Traffic officer of said city, and said motion being duly seconded by Rush Sword, thereupon the roll call of the council ~~ef-th~~ was had, and the vote was as follows:

J.S. Cline be allowed the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, as rental on Police Station, for the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the year 1928, due and payable on June 1st, of each year, as per contract.

ORDERED THAT:

J.S. Cline be allowed the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, as rental on Fire Station, for the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the year 1928, due and payable on June 1st, of each year, as per contract.

On motion made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until June 7th, at 7:30 o'clock, 1928.
