The Mayor, pursuant to the foregoing order, appointed on said committee, to report on Sinking Fund account of Water Department, Councilmen, J.S. Cline, and I.E. Brooks.

Councilman, J.S. Cline, moved that the City Attorney be directed, to noticy the Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company, to restore the original rates as set out in the original franchise, as sold by the city of Pikeville, Ky., and under which the Southern Bell Telephone & Telegraph Co., is now operating in said city, and said motion being duly seconded by Richard Thompson, upon a roll call of the council, they voted as follows:

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Councilman, J.S. Cline, moved the adoption of the following rules and regulations, for the Police Department:

POLICE REGULATIONS

TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE AND POLICEMEN OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY:

You are hereby directed to observe and carry out the following rules and regulations:

1. The chief of police shall serve and be on duty from hours of 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. and at such other times as designated by the mayor.

2. Lon Robinson, Policeman, shall serve and be on duty from hour of 6:30 p.m. to 4:00 a.m. and such other times as designated by the Mayor.

3. I.A. Duty, Policeman, shall serve and be on duty from hour of 6:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. and such other times as designated by mayor.

4. Weekly the two policemen shall exchange hours, that is, second week after these rules take effect, Duty shall serve time mentioned herein for Robinson, and Robinson shall serve time mentioned herein for Duty.

5. All Policemen xkxxxxxxixixxxxxxx, including the chief, shall strictly enforce all laws and ordinances, and be subject to orders of mayor at all times. They shall further acquaint themselves with all city ordinances and enforce same.

6. The night policemen shall visit every portion of the city (From Happy Hollow to Bridge on Mayor trail at lower end of town) one or more times each night.

7. It shall be the duty of the night policemen to report to man in charge of fire station once every hour, and oftener, if possible, unless otherwise occupied, so that the public may notify the fire station of any matter which needs attention of policemen, during night hours.

8. It shall further be the duty of all pobicemen to report to police court each day not later than 2;00 o'clock p.m. for purpose of serving as witnesses, waiting on court, or in any needed official capacity.

9. Non-performance of these rules and regulations shall place the non-performer liable to having charges preferred against him for removal from office.

10. These rules and regulations are subject to change at any time.

Various citizens living on Kentucky Avenue appeared before the City Council and made complaints that the street cleaners were not cleaning said street, and also about sewer conditions existing at and on said streets, and on motion made seconded and carried, said complaints are referred to the Street Committee, and they will investigate and report on same.
