Councilman, J.S. Cline introduced and read an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A BUDGET SYSTEM FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE FISCAL AFFAIRS OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY, FOR THE YEAR JULY 1, 1928, TO JULY 1, 1929: AND FOR THE ESTIMATED REVENUES FOR SAID CITY FOR SAID YEAR, AND CLASSIFYING THE VARIOUS EXPENDITURES OF SAME." and moved the adoption of said ordinance, and said motion being duly seconded by I.E. Brooks, upon a roll call of the council, the vote was as follows:

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Ky., convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 3rd day of July, 1928, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, J.S. Cline,, Oscar Jackson, and Richard Thompson:

All minutes of the Common Council not heretofore approved, are now read and approved by the Council.

On motion of J.S. Cline, duly seconded and carried, Jasper Smiles is granted a building permit to construct a concrete block building on the corner of 2nd and Division Street:

On motion made seconded and carried, the matter of buying metal signs for the direction of traffic on the city streets, is referred to the Street Committee, and they will report their finds to the Council at its next regular meeting.

Councilman, J.S. Cline, moved that the Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., issue a proclamation designating the week beginning July 9th, and ending July 14th, 1928, as Rat Killing Week, in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

Various citizens living on Kentucky Avenue appeared before the City Council and made complaints that the street cleaners were not cleaning said street, and also about sewer conditions existing at and on said streets, and on motion made seconded and carried, said complaints are referred to the Street Committee, and they will investigate and report on same.

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Councilman, J.S. Cline, moved, that the Police Department have the catch basins, in the city of Pikeville, Ky., cleaned out, and that the cost of having same done, be deducted from the salary of the Street Cleaner, whose duty it is to have same done, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

Councilman, Rush Sword, now present.

Councilman, J.S. Cline, moved that J.M. Hatcher, City Attorney, investigate the complaints made by several citizens, to the City Council, with reference to the unsanitary conditions of various buildings within the city, and report his findings and recommendations to the Council at its next regular meeting, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

Councilman, E.E. Trivette, now present:

Councilman, Richard Thompson, moved that the City Clerk be directed to advertise for bids on the Street Cleaning Contract of the city, of Pikeville, Ky., and that same be advertised for at least 10 days, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

Alex L. Ratliff appeared before the City Council and asked that a permit be granted to the Pikeville Supply & Planing Mill Company, to install a gasoline tank on their property at the upper end of the city, and upon motion, made seconded and carried, this request is referred to the City Attorney, and he is directed to investigate same and report to the Council his findings and recommendations at its next regular meeting.

Hon. Sidney Trivette appeared before the City Council, and asked for a permit to be granted to the Cannon Ball Cab & Bus Company, permitting them to mark off a parking space in front of their building on Main Street, for a distance of 50 feet, and said permit is granted by a unanimous vote of the city council.

On motion made, seconded and carried, the City Clerk is directed to make a final settlement with all persons collecting money for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky.

On motion made seconded and unanimously carried, it is ordered that John M. Hatcher be, and he is hereby exonerated from payment of taxes upon the sum of \$500.00, for the year 1927, it appearing that same was clerical error.

Councilman, J.S. Cline, moved that the City Clerk make out a list of all persons due to pay License Fees to the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for the year 1928, and deliver same to the City Attorney, and the City Attorney is directed to take warrants for all parties not paying said fees on or before the 10th day of July, 1928, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

Councilman, J.S. Cline moved that the City Treasurer be directed to make out an itemized statement of all outstanding, unpaid vouchers now due by the city, and that he further make up an itemized statement of the sinking fund account and the interest accrued thereon, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote

On motion duly made, seconded and carried by a unanimous vote, the request made by the Pikeville Ice Company and the Pikeville Supply & Planing Mill Company, for an exoneration on taxes charged against them for the years 1925 and 1926, is referred to the City Attorney, and he is directed to investigate said matter and report to the City Council his findings and recommendations at their next regular meeting.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, by a unanimous vote, the request of E.F. Harrison, for an exoneration from paying the taxes charge against him for the years 1926 and 1927, is referred to the City Attorney, and he will report on same, to the Council, at its next regular meeting.

The Bill presented by Mrs. N. Starkey, for repairing street in the construction of water main, caused by the paving of the alley back of her place is referred to the Street Committee, and they will investigate same and report their findings to the Council at its next regular meeting.

On motion made, duly seconded and carried, the Settlement made by the City Clerk, with the Chief of Police, of the City of Pikeville, Ky., for the month of June, 1928, is approved and ordered spread at large on the book for that purpose.

T.E. Newton be allowed the sum of One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars, for Salary as Supt. of Water Dept. for month of June, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

A.S. Corbin be allowed the sum of One Hundred Twenty Five (\$125.00) Dollars, for Salary as Pump Operator for water dept. for month of June, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Kentucky & W.Va. Power Co. be allowed the sum of Three Hundred Fifteen and 64/100 (\$315.64) Dollars, for power furnished the water dept. for month of June, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:
