

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held in the city hall of said city, on the 7th day of August, 1928, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, I.E. Brooks, J.S. Cline, Oscar Jackson, Rush Sword, E.E. Trivette, and Richard Thompson.

On motion made, seconded and carried by a unanimous vote, the reading of the minutes are dispensed with until the next meeting of the Council.

J.S. Cline moved that the Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., be directed to negotiate a loan by the City of Pikeville, Ky., for money to take care of each budget fund set out under the Budget Bill, until taxes are collected for the year 1928, and said motion being duly seconded by E.E. Trivette, upon a roll call of the council, the vote was as follows:

"The City Clerk makes the following report".

TO THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, PIKE COUNTY, KENTUCKY:

I, J.E. Sanders, Clerk of the Common Council of said city, beg leave to report that pursuant to instructions of your Honorable Board, contained in a resolution adopted on the 19th day of June, 1928, after having first advertised the time, place and terms of sale and the rights to be sold by posting on the day of June, 1928, five (5) written or printed notices, one at the front door of the Court House in said city and one in four other public places in said town of Pikeville, Kentucky, and by advertising same in the Pike County News for three consecutive issues, a weekly news paper, published in the city of Pikeville, Ky., offered for sale at public outcry to the highest and best bidder, at the front door of the Court House, in said city of Pikeville, Ky., until twelve o'clock (12:00) m., noon on the 21st day of July, 1928, and received bids for the right, privilege, franchise and authority to erect, construct, operate and maintain a gas plant, pipe lines &c., in said city of Pikeville, Ky., and that I received the following bids for said franchise, viz:

FEDERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES COMPANY OF KENTUCKY . \$100.00

which said bid is attached hereto and made a part of this report.

Councilman, E.E. Trivette, moved that the report of the City Clerk in selling the Gas Franchise be received and filed, and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

Councilman, J.S. Cline, introduced an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance amending an Ordinance, entitled, (An Ordinance providing for the selling at Public Bidding to the highest bidder of the franchise, rights, and privileges of entering in, through and under the streets, alleys, public ways, bridges, side walks, parks and other public places in the city of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, to lay, construct, maintain and operate gas pipes, mains and all appliances and appurtenances necessary thereto for the purpose supplying, distributing and selling natural and ore artificial gas to said city of Pikeville, Kentucky and to individuals, firms, corporations and others residing or located within the corporate limits of said town for a period of twenty years, prescribing the terms and conditions thereof and granting said franchise, rights and privileges to the highest and best bidder therefor, his or its successors and assigns.) and moved that same be passed, adopted and approved, and said motion being duly seconded by E.E. Trivette, upon a roll call of the council, the vote was as follows:

"

T.J. Kendrick be allowed the sum of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars, for salary as Police Judge, for month of July, 1928, payable out of the Officers Salary budget fund.

ORDERED THAT:

T.J. Kendrick be allowed the sum of Forty (\$40.00) Dollars, for salary as clerk hire for Police Judge for month of July 1928, payable out of Officers Salary budget fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Bennie England be allowed the sum of Ninety Three (\$93.00) Dollars, for salary as caretaker of fire station for July @ \$3.00 per day, payable out of Officers Salary budget fund.

Ky. & W. Va. Power Co. be allowed the sum of Three Hundred Nine and 38/100 (\$309.38) Dollars, for power furnished for street lights for July, 1928, payable out of the Street Lighting budget fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Earl & Johns Scott be allowed the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, for cleaning streets for month of July 1928, as per contract, payable out of the Street cleaning budget fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Walter Hatcher be allowed the sum of Twelve and 50/100 (\$12.50) Dollars, for salary as City Treasurer for month of July, 1928, payable out of the Officers salary budget fund.

ORDERED THAT:

J.E. Sanders be allowed the sum of One Hundred One and 05/100 (\$101.05) Dollars, for salary & services as City clerk for month of July 1928, payable out of officers salary budget fund.

ORDERED THAT:

W.B. Syek be allowed the sum of Four and 27/100 (\$4.27) Dollars, for $1\frac{1}{2}\%$ Commission on collecting taxes \$284.44, as per contract for July, 1928.

ORDERED THAT:

A.S. Corbin be allowed the sum of One Hundred Twenty Five (\$125.00) Dollars, for salary as Pump Operator for water Dept. for month of July, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:


T.E. Newton be allowed the sum of One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars, for salary as Supt. of the water Dept., for month of July, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Ky. & W. Va., power company be allowed the sum of Three Hundred Twenty Six and 80/100 (\$326.80) Dollars, for power furnished water Dept. for month of July, 1928, payable out of the water fund.

On motion made duly seconded and carried by a unanimous vote, Council is adjourned until the 14th day of August, 1928.
