

## MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held on the 30th day of October 1928, at the city hall of said city, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen I.E. Brooks, J.S. Cline and Richard Thompson.

On motion made, seconded and darried, it is ordered that public liability and property damage insurance be purchased for the fire truck.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that a committee be appointed to investigate the advisability of insuring city property against fire and property damage &c.,

The mayor thereupon appointed on said committee, Councilmen, J.S. Cline and Richard Thompson.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE regulating direction of motor and vehicle traffic on Division, Grace & Caroline streets between main and second streets in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky and regulating parking thereon and proving a penalty for violation thereof." is introduced and read to the council, and councilman J.S. Cline moved the adoption of same and said motion being duly seconded by I.E. Books, upon a roll call of the council the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced, the Mayor thereupon declared said motion carried and said ordinance adopted.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE regulating parking of motor vehicles on Main Street of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and proving a penalty for violation thereon." is presented and read to the council and J.S. Cline moved the adoption of said ordinance and said motion being duly seconded by I.E. Brooks, upon a roll call of the council the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced, the Mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance adopted.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried the Traffic Committee is continued until they complete their work on traffic ordinances.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE authorizing the institution and prosecution of condemnation proceedings for and on behalf of the City of Pikeville against the Chesapeake & Ohio Railway Company for the purpose of obtaining an easement over a portion of its right of way in said city", is presented and read and J.S. Cline moved the adoption of same and said motion being duly seconded by Richard Thompson, upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced the Mayor declared said motion carried and said Ordinance adopted.

Cline moved that ~~On motion duly seconded and carried~~ the city Attorney is ordered and directed to institute suit on behalf of city to recover for the various parties interest on all deposits made by various persons for light meters required by the Kentucky & West Virginia Power Company, and asked that the consideration and vote on said motion be postponed until the next meeting of the Board

Councilman, J.S. Cline moved that the City Attorney be directed to institute an action to set aside that franchise granted by the city council, whereby the increase was granted to the Southern Bell Telephone & Telegraph Company, and that there by appropriated a sufficient amount of money out of its funds to have said action properly prosecuted, seeking to set aside the increase obtained under said franchise and asked that the consideration and vote on said motion be postponed until the next regular meeting of the Board.

Councilman, J.S. Cline introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE creating and defining sewer zones in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, and providing for the construction of Sewer Systems therein, and for the payment of the construction of same.", and moved the adoption of said ordinance by the city council, and asked that the vote on said ordinance be postponed until the next regular meeting of the Board, which was granted.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks moved that M.T. Scalf and Albert Bentley be allowed the sum of \$15.00 each for services as Special Policemen of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, serving in the absence of the regular policemen, Walter Robinson and Lon Robinson, absent because of the death of mother, and J.S. Cline moved to disallow the claims of M.T. Scalf and Albert Bentley, and said motion of J.S. Cline being duly seconded by Richard Thompson, upon a roll call of the council, the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced the Mayor thereupon voted "No", and declared said motion to disallow said claims lost.

On motion of I.E. Brooks, duly seconded by J.S. Cline, and carried, it is ordered that Albert Bentley and M.T. Scalf be allowed the sum of \$10.00, each as Special Policeman for the city of Pikeville, Kentucky.

On motion made, seconded and carried, Council adjourned until Thursday November 1st, 1928.,

At a regular adjourned meeting convened and held at the city hall of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 1st day of November, 1928, the following were present: Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen, I.E. Brooks, J.S. Cline, Oscar Jackson, Rush Sword, E.E. Trivette,

J.S. Cline moved that the City Treasurer be directed to return to the Federal Public Utilities Company, the Five Thousand (\$5000.00) Dollar check, as they have complied with all provisions of the contract and the Gas Franchise, and said motion being duly seconded, carried.

On motion made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that the Supt. of the water Department furnish to the City Attorney a list of all delinquents water users, up to November 1st, 1928, which carried.

ORDERED THAT:

Cedar Creek Lumber Company be allowed the sum of Forty and 37/100 (\$40.37) Dollars, for lumber furnished to build side walk on Cline Street, payable out of General Expenditure Budget fund.

ORDERED THAT:

Charley Dye be allowed the sum of Sixty Two and 60/100 (\$62.60) Dollars for work and material furnished on building side walk on Cline Street, payable out of General Expenditure Budget fund.

On motion made seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date, November 6th, 1928.
