

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 22nd day of January 1929, the following were present, Mayor, Geo. Pinson Jr., Councilmen I.E. Brooks, G.H. Francisco, Rush Sword, Richard Thompson, and E.E. Trivette.

On motion of Rush Sword, duly seconded by G.H. Francisco and unanimously carried, it is ordered that Alex Lemon be exonerated from payment of city taxes on a valuation of \$1500.00 for the year 1928, same being error, said amount to be deducted from taxes as follows: General Fund \$11.25 Special Levy \$7.50.

Mary E. Pauley and her husband, J.F. Pauley presented in open council a contract of agreement between Mary E. Pauley and J.F. Pauley, her husband, Mrs. Hope Wellman and A.H. Wellman, her husband and T.C. Buskirk and Mrs. Mary Buskirk his wife and the parties of the first part and the City of Pikeville Kentucky a municipality of the second party of date 22nd day of January 1929, for a sewer right of way in south Pikeville, and Councilman Rush Sword moved that said contract be accepted and that same be executed upon behalf of the city by its proper officers and said motion was duly seconded by G.H. Francisco, and upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced the mayor declared said motion carried.

Councilman, G.H. Francisco introduced an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND RE-CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR OF SEWER IN SOUTH END OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY." and moved that said Ordinance be adopted and Richard Thompson seconded said motion and upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of the vote being announced the mayor declared said motion carried and said ordinance adopted.

Richard Thompson moved that the City Attorney be directed to prepare an Ordinance for the consideration of the council at its next regular meeting, placing a penalty on all taxes due the city of Pikeville for the year 1928 and unpaid on or before February 15th 1929, and said motion being duly seconded, carried.

Councilman, I.E. Brooks moved that the Mayor appoint a committee to consider the advisability of purchasing an automobile for the Police Department and the City of Pikeville and report their recommendations at its next regular meeting and if they recommend that same be purchased, they shall recommend the kind of car and said motion being duly seconded, carried by a unanimous vote.

The mayor, pursuant to the foregoing motion, appointed on said committee G.H. Francisco, and E.E. Trivette, and they will report their recommendations to the council at its next regular meeting.

ORDERED THAT:

The South Eastern Kentucky Utilities Company be allowed the sum of \$54.77 for repairing street at second and Pike streets, between Pike and Jefferson Hotels, when they present bill properly signed and verified.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date, February 5th, 1929.
